

READING AT HOME

We often talk about the importance of reading at home... it really does make a difference!!

We see how children who read frequently at home progress with their learning and make great progress in their learning across the curriculum.

Reading at home does not need to arduous, 20 minutes a day can make a huge difference. This may the child reading to you, sharing the reading responsibilities, and on some occasions you reading them a story. When you do

read at home please make a short comment in your child's reading record, or for older children they can make their own comments. Key to successful reading is asking your child about the book that they have just read/ heard. Can they recall information, talk about what has happened, consider how the characters might be feeling, or make a prediction as to what will happen next?



YEAR GROUP UPDATES

This week the children in Early Years have thoroughly enjoyed a story called 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear What do you See?' by Eric Carle. They have been ordering what the brown bear saw and enjoyed learning about colours. The theme around colours led us smoothly onto 'The Colour Monster' which gave many opportunities to discuss emotions linked to colours. This forms the basis of a worry box with have in each class, encouraging children to discuss their emotions and feelings, especially when school might still feel new and unfamiliar. The number rhymes we have been sharing have also supported counting and rhyming. Cherry Class had Forest School this week and really enjoyed this experience. Next week we will have fun exploring 'Funnybones' by the Ahlbergs.

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Friday is upon us again! Next week is the Year 1 trip to Asda and in preparation, we have been looking at fruit and vegetables and taste testing! This term, the children will be making fruit kebabs so it has been really exciting watching them explore their favourite tastes and textures! Also this week ... English: we have focused on speech sounds we often get mixed up. Maths: greater than, fewer than and we have even started to look at place value! Super smart of us! We have continued to look at online safety. Ask the children how they would keep safe on their devices? and ask the children to give you a rendition of the 'down in the jungle' a song we have been learning in music. Have a lovely weekend, see you Monday.

It has been an exciting and productive week in Year 2 as our young children continue to explore new topics and develop essential skills. They began the week by receiving a special visit from Obb the Alien, who needed their help to learn how to put on a jumper. Through this activity, the children quickly grasped the importance of clear and precise instructions. Wrapping up the week, our young writers had great fun by following instructions to create delicious marmalade sandwiches. Next week, they will put their knowledge to work by writing their own clear and effective instructions. Place value was the topic in maths. They used place value cards and base ten materials to break down numbers into Tens and Ones. In History, the children were tasked with creating persuasive posters inviting skilled craftsmen to participate in the construction of this unsinkable Titanic. In DT, our young engineers delved into the world of mechanisms, focusing on the vital role of levers and linkages in everyday products. Have a lovely weekend!

Year 3 have had another busy week. In English, the children wrote their own alternative ending for Stone Age Boy. They focussed on using good description, adverbs and have started to organise their writing into paragraphs. They are really beginning to develop their stamina for independent writing. In maths we have continued to develop our understanding of place value, even including tenths e.g. 0.1, 0.2, 0.3! We have started to use this to record measures using centimetres, millimetres and metres, and will continue over the next two weeks when measuring capacity and mass. Next week we will begin a new class text: *How To Wash A Woolly Mammoth* which will link to learning about writing instructions. It's a wonderful book and we're sure the children will love it! Our spelling focus next week will be the long 'a' sound made by the letters ei as in eight and weight. Have a good weekend everyone.

Year 4 have had another busy week. In English they have been continuing with their descriptive writing, creating stories about when a storm hit Hastings. We have decided that the weather really wanted to give the children a helping hand. Maybe we should try writing about some beautiful sunny weather to try and bring it back. In maths, the children have continued with their work linked to place value. They have been applying their knowledge from the last couple of weeks to converting units of length and problem solving using money. In PSHE, they have been looking at the UN Convention on the rights of a child and understanding the difference between rights and responsibilities. There were some very grown up and thoughtful conversations held. We have also spent time getting used to Rollama. We are looking forward to using this more frequently in school to support our spelling and grammar tasks. We have also told the children to keep an eye out for the tasks we are setting. As mentioned last week we have a date for your diaries - On Tuesday 10th October, we will be hosting a quick parents meet about the statutory Times Table assessment that your child will complete at the end of the academic year. The meeting will be held at the end of the school day, please meet us on the KS1 playground at 3.20 (or once you have collected your child/children).

This week in Year 5, we have continued to read 'The lion and the Unicorn'. Lenny has now been evacuated to the countryside and he is not having a very nice time. Last week, the children wrote a diary entry before he was evacuated and this week they have been writing another entry recounting what has happened after. Will he be reunited with his mum? In maths, we have continued with place value and measure. In preparation for our trip next week, we have been learning about evacuees and who was evacuated in WWII. In geography, we have been looking at human features of the UK. For Science, we have been looking at gravity and using newton-meters to measure the mass and the weight of objects. We hope you all have a lovely weekend and we are excited for our trip on Tuesday.

This week Year 6 have been delving further into our book Who Let the Gods Out? We have been meeting new characters and learning about the quest that Virgo and Elliot are now on, finding the Chaos Stones before evil Thanatos does! We have also worked really hard writing our formal letters as Elliot trying to persuade the loan company to help him repay (or not repay!) his loan his ill mother got out. We have also had a brain frazzling week in

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maths rounding lots of high numbers all the way up to the millions! This week we've also started our science topic with a double lesson of our new Light unit. We have discovered that light only travels in straight lines and cannot bend and we learned how our fascinating eyes work! We also have had double history, learning about how impactful the Greek king Alexander the Great was and what was so special and unique about the Battle of Marathon. This was a really interesting lesson as we evaluated the key strategies that the Greek Army used in order to win – ask your child which strategy they thought was the best one and why. In Art we also continued our Greek Vase designs ready to make some with clay later on in the term. Next week we look forward to learning about the Greek Gods, if your child can do any research at home about the famous 12 Greek Gods over the weekend that would be amazing, they can bring in what they have found out and it will help with their Greek God report writing tremendously. Have a lovely weekend.
