## CSDA Happenings

**Grade 4:** In writing, students are learning about how to correct sentence fragments and run on sentences. In social studies, students are starting projects on the Abenaki Native Americans.

**Grade 5:** In math, students are wrapping up our first unit which was place value. Next week, we will continue our learning in the topic of astronomy.

**Grade 6:** Sixth graders are getting the routines and schedules of switching classes down more smoothly! Students are working on their first science and social studies units of Ecology and Map Skills.

**CSDA Special:** In fourth grade, we are learning about Jazz, the history of Jazz, and what makes up a Jazz Band. In fifth grade, we are learning about how to conduct using conducting patterns and then listen to pieces then decipher what time the piece is in. In sixth grade, we are looking at how music is in every subject in school! All grades are learning about swing rhythm and learning a Orffin' Blues Song on orff instruments. Have a wonderful weekend.

## RMMS Happenings

**Pre-K:** Preschoolers will begin learning about apples next week. Now that they have learned the routines and about classroom tools, they will begin working on the curriculum.

**Grade K:** Kindergarteners will be working to add details to their "teaching books". They will begin to use beginning sounds to label their drawings.

**Grade 1:** First graders will explore apples to celebrate the beginning of fall and Johnny Appleseed's birthday. They will wrap up their review of letter sounds and formation and begin their review of cvc words.

**Grade 2:** Second graders will be exploring the connection between addition and subtraction in math. Students are starting a "how to" writing unit and are reviewing closed syllable words in Foundations.

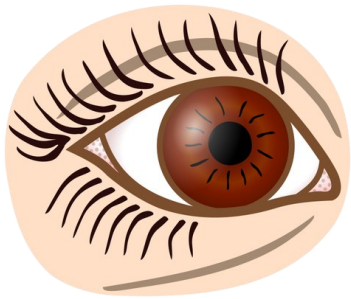
**Grade 3:** Third graders will be working through multiplication strategies and starting to build their fact fluency in math. In ELA, students will continue building a reading life and participating in writing boot camp to strengthen their skills. Finally, in science students are learning about fossils!

In **music**, Kindergarten is singing songs such as Old Mac Donald. First and second grades are learning about solfege Sol and Mi and using them in songs like the Apple Tree and Rain, Rain Go Away. Third graders are learning about the whole note and the instruments of Africa!

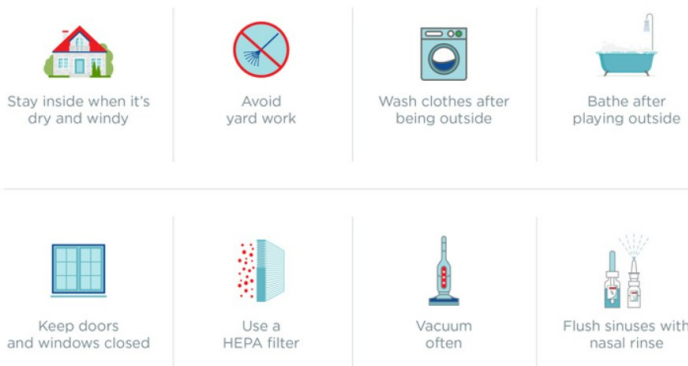
### Upcoming Screenings in October 2023

## COVID GUIDELINES & RESOURCES:

**Q: What symptoms should I look for with the latest covid variant?**

**A:** People with the latest COVID-19 variant are primarily reporting: sore throat, cough, congestion and runny nose. Other symptoms may include fatigue, headache, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, loss of taste and/or smell, fever, chills, body aches, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing.

**Q. What should I do if my child has symptoms or a positive COVID test?**

**A.** If your child has symptoms, obtain a COVID test. If your child tests positive for COVID stay home and begin to isolate. **Contact your child's school nurse to determine a return to school plan.** The link below CDC guidelines, includes a calculator to determine isolation and masking calculator embedded in them.

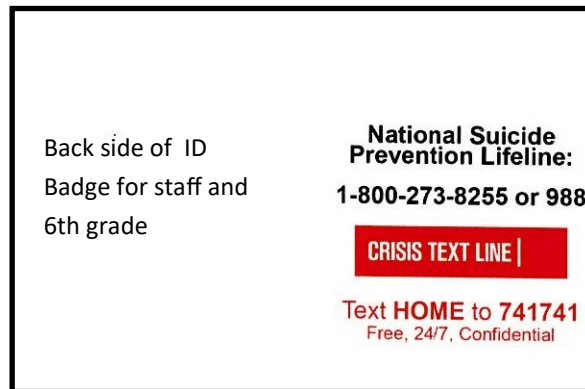

## Back Side of ID Badges

Your student may have shared with you that the back of all staff badges and sixth grade students' identification cards shows the contact information for the Suicide and Crisis Lifeline (988 or 1-800-273-8255) and the Crisis Text Line (741741). New Hampshire's "Jason Dickey Suicide Prevention Act", under RSA 193-J:2-a Public School Identification Cards, requires that, for students in grades 6-12, *"The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline shall be labeled on student identification cards and include the telephone number: National Suicide Prevention Lifeline 1-800-273-8255 or 988."* These numbers provide all staff and students with immediate access to safe and confidential resources in times of need through 24/7 call, text and chat access to trained crisis counselors.
