




First Month of School!

HEALTH OFFICE

We're off to a great year in the Health Office. Many children visit each day for things like a bloody nose, when they lose a tooth or when their stomach is upset. Parents/Guardians will be called if your child has a fever at 100 degrees or higher, if they have injured their head in any way or if there is a concerning situation. Here are a few reminders and requests as we begin the school year:

- If your child needs to take medication at school, prescription or over the counter, it must be distributed through our health office and be accompanied by a note from the physician for prescription and parent for over the counter medication.
- If your child has the stomach flu, they may not attend school for 24 hours after vomiting.
- Due to a wide range of allergies, health issues and promoting healthy choices, we will not be sharing any food items for birthday treats at school.

We want to keep everyone healthy. If there's anything we need to know to help your child stay well, please contact us.

ATTENDANCE

Academic success and regular attendance go together. Frequent student absences or tardies disrupt the learning process. It is in the best interest of your child's education if appointments can be made to avoid school hours. Please make sure regular attendance is your goal. If you are going to be absent or late coming to school, call the Attendance Line at (651) 653-2859.

STUDENT CHECK OUT

Although we encourage appointments outside of the school day, we recognize that sometimes schedules are out of our control. If you need to pick your child up early, please follow these procedures:

- Park near the flagpole and enter at Door "A"
- Sign your child out in our Main Office
- Our staff will call your child to the office to meet you there.



Cell Phone/Smartwatch Expectations and Outcomes

Cell Phone Guidelines

The intent of these guidelines is to minimize distractions and emphasize a focus on academics during the school day.

- 1. Cell phones should not be used and must be put away and silenced during the school day. Smart watches should only be used as a traditional watch, checking the time/date, during school hours.
- **2.** Parents are welcome to contact our main office if there is a message that needs to be relayed.
- **3.** Students/families assume the risk of damage, theft or loss when choosing to bring/send a phone/watch to school.
- **4.** Electronic device use, of any kind, is not permitted in bathrooms or on the bus.
- **5.** Students may not use electronic devices to photograph or record students or staff at school.
- **6.** Using social media, apps, or any other function of a device to spread rumors, bully, make fun of, exclude, or create a disruption in school or outside of school is not permitted.

We recognize that some families want their children to have a phone for before or after school use. Our goal is to maximize learning during the school day and we want to minimize distractions and disruptions for all students; as a result, if a student is not following our guidelines the following will occur:

1st Offense - The device will be taken by the teacher, given back at the end of the day and parents will be informed.

2nd Offense - The device will be taken by the teacher and held in the office until a parent or guardian picks it up.

3rd Offense - The device will be held by the principal and a conversation will occur to make a plan with the student, parent and administrator when the device is collected.


