DIPLOMA PROGRAM:

Students take six IB courses, one from each of the IB groups (three are higher level and three are standard level).

Students must complete the DP core (see opposite panel).

Students complete assessments that are both internally and externally assessed.

CAREER-RELATED PROGRAM:

Students take at least two IB courses which can be either higher level or standard level.

Students must complete the CP core (see next panel).

Students complete a CTE pathway.

Students complete assessments that are both internally and externally assessed.

What is an IB Education?

"The aim of all IB programs is to develop internationally minded people who, recognizing their common humanity and shared guardianship of the planet, help to create a better and more peaceful world.

An IB Education: is student centered and helps students to develop the attitudes and skills they need for both academic and personal success. It focuses on developing the skills of learning.

The IB aspires to help schools develop well-rounded students with character who respond to challenges with optimism and an open mind, are confident in their own identities, make ethical decisions, join with others in celebrating our common humanity and are prepared to apply what they learn in real-world, complex and unpredictable situations." - *IBO.org*

THE CAREER-RELATED PROGRAM CORE

THE DIPLOMA PROGRAM CORE:

- **The Reflective Project** asks students to engage in an indepth body of work. Through the reflective project, students identify analyze, discuss and evaluate an ethical dilemma associated with an issue from their careerrelated studies.
- The Personal Professional Skills course develops responsibility, practical, problem-solving, good intellectual habits and an ethical understanding, among other skills. The emphasis of the course is placed on the development of skills needed to succesfully navigate higher education, the workplace and society.
- **Service Learning** is the practical application of knowledge and skill toward an identified community need. Through service, students develop and apply personal and social skills in real-life situations.
- Language Development ensures that all CP students have access and exposure to a second language. The opportunity to learn a second language is central to an IB education and increases students' understanding of the wider world. Students are encouraged to begin or extend the study of an additional language that suits their needs.
- The Career-related studies (CTE Program of Study) are offered to provide students with practical, real-world approaches to learning designed to prepare them for higher education, an internship or apprenticeship, or a position in a designated field of interest.

- **The Extended Essay** asks students to engage in independent research through an in-depth study of a question relating to one of the DP subjects they are studying. The World Studies Extended Essay option allows students to focus on a topic of global significance, which they examine through the lens of at least two DP subjects.
- Theory of Knowledge develops a coherent approach to learning that unifies the academic disciplines. In this course on critical thinking, students inquire into the nature of knowing and deepen their understanding of knowledge as a human construction.
- Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) involves students in a range of activities alongside their academic studies throughout the DP. Creativity encourages students to engage in the arts and creative thinking. Activity seeks to develop a healthy lifestyle through physical activity. Service with the community offers a vehicle for a new learning with academic value. The three strands of CAS enhance students' personal and interpersonal development through experiential learning and enable journeys of self-discovery.
