Mission to Mars - Aviation Space Camp

A group of middle school students had the opportunity to attend Mission to Mars Aviation Space Camp. The students designed rockets and attempted lift off using Newton's Laws of Motion. They quickly discovered that rocket science is all about trial and error. If the launches failed, the students adjusted their designs and tried again.

Campers studied the Earth's crust and how it differs from conditions found on Mars. Through a variety of hands-on, STEM learning activities, they created creatures, rovers, maps, and more. The group ventured to the Museum of Flight for a day of aviation focused fun. They experimented with the flight simulator, toured exhibits, and let their imaginations soar.

Attendance Matters

Attendance rates are an important indicator of student success. In fact, missing just two days per month can negatively impact academic performance. **Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track for graduation.** According to Attendanceworks.org:

- Absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, or facing some other potentially serious difficulty.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, regular attendance is a predictor of graduation rates.
- Missing 10 percent (about 18 days) of the school year can drastically affect a student's academic success.
- Attendance is an important life skill that will help your child graduate from college and keep a job.



Good Attendance: 9 or fewer absences. Students with good attendance generally have higher grades and enjoy school more. Students benefit from attending school regularly.



Warning: 10 to 17 missed days. Students who miss an average of 15 days a year will miss a whole year's worth of school before their senior year.



Chronic Absenteeism: 18 or more missed days. Lost classroom time is lost opportunities to learn. Missing just one day every two weeks adds up to 18 days in a year.

Dive into the Newly Renovated South Kitsap High School Pool

The South Kitsap High School pool is opening after an extensive renovation and modernization. The pool itself was demolished and the systems replaced to meet modern health and safety standards. The scope of the project included new roofing, lighting, pool decking, tilework and locker room spaces as well as building siding and roofing.

The pool is used extensively throughout the school year for swim instruction, water sports, and lifeguarding. After hours, the pool is home to water polo, swim and dive athletes. The community enjoys recreational swim and the pool is rented out by private swim clubs and for family parties.

The pool renovation was funded by the voter approved capital levy that ended collection in 2022.
