
DAY 3 - Great Wall

DAY 4 - Cultural Activities




- ✓ Visit a local middle school class to observe and study Chinese painting together.

Day 5 - Take a Bullet Train to Chengdu


1267 miles in only 7 hours - Average speed of 180 mph! Get to view many of China's various landforms




From Beijing to Chengdu

 - Walk and play with them










DAY 7 - Leshan Giant Buddha

Cost

The China tour will cost \$1200-1300 per student

Includes: hotels, transportation within China, meals and activity fees

(Boston to Bejing plane ticket not included)

from chengdu to beijing= \$200 ish

Airfare from Boston to Beijing will be approximately \$800-1500 (depending on when tickets are purchased)

Total Cost = \$2100-2800

Frequently Asked Questions



IS IT SAFE TO TRAVEL TO CHINA?

YES!

Q: What will be the transportation like?

A: The bus we use is air-conditioned. We always provide a vehicle that is larger than required for the number of people in your group to keep at least 20% vacancy rate. Our drivers are selected for their driving ability and knowledge.

Q: What do Chinese hotels look like?

A: We choose centrally located hotels which are evaluated by National Tourism Administration according to a strict standard. The hotels usually provide the following facilities: TV, refrigerator, telephone, central control, bathroom with 24 hours hot water, bath lotion, soaps, tooth brushes and pastes, sterile towels and toilet paper.

Q: What do we eat?

A: We select specified local Chinese restaurants which are very popular among the locals. By moving from city to city during the tour, you will sample food which has local characteristics, spicy, light, more salty and so on. Some of the meals are not included so that you could have a chance to try local "street food", such as cold noodles, fried scorpions, stinky Tofu and etc.

Q: Can we change activities during the tour?

A: The itinerary agenda can be changed whenever necessary. Your tour guides are highly flexible and will change the route or agenda based on your travel pace, the traffic and other circumstances.

Q: What if my kid got sick or if there was any emergency during the program?

A: We will contact local best hospital at the first place if necessary. China hospitals are qualified to treat foreign friends with advanced equipment and English-speaking doctors. We will also contact the parents to get the permission for any necessary treatments.

What to Pack?



--- Basic Essentials

- All documents including valid passport, visa, air ticket, related health certificates, and other necessary documents
- Appropriate luggage with locks & ID tags (Locks are needed for checked baggage when flying inside China.)
- Contact List with information of your travel advisor, tour guide, embassy, as well as your family and friends.
- Credit card, travelers check, and certain amount money
- A power convert and adapter plugs
- A first-aid kit with some medicine for common use, such as Aspirin, vitamins, anti-inflammatory and so on.

- Appropriate clothing for the weather and your activities
- Comfortable footwear
- Rain gear
- Sun protection (hats, sunglasses)

---Toiletries

Most of these things can be bought in China or available in your hotel rooms in a similar form to the West, but you may want to bring your own for your convenience/preference.

- Comb/brush
- Toothbrush, toothpaste, dental floss
- Shampoo, shower gel, soap, towel, flannel
- Blow dryer
- Deodorant
- Lotions, creams
- Sunscreen, moisturizer, lip balm
- Towelettes
- Shaver, shaving cream
- Nail clippers, and other personal hygiene items

--- Medication

- Small emergency first aid kit
- Aspirin / pain reliever
- Diarrhea medicine / laxative
- Contact lens preparations, eye drops
- Motion sickness medicine
- Allergy medicine
- Sleep medication
- Personal prescriptions
- Medical record (if necessary)
- Contact information of doctor or medical adviser

--- Electronics

- (Video) camera, with batteries and charger
- Cellphone and charger (optional)
- Laptop/tablet (optional)

--- Other Suggestions

- Small flashlight
- Reading materials
- Guide books, maps, dictionary/phrasebook
- Games/music (PSP, media player)
- Ziplock plastic bags
- Insect repellent
- Wipes, hand sanitizer
- Umbrella (fold up)
