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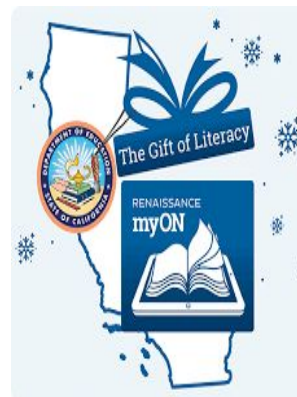

## CDE Announces Digital Reading Partnership for Winter Break!

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Ahead of winter break, State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond on Nov. 30 announced a digital reading partnership with Renaissance to give unlimited access to **myON** digital books and news articles to all preK-12 California students between Dec. 1, 2021, and Jan. 31, 2022. The initiative helps to advance the state's literacy campaign, which aims to have all California students reading fluently by third grade by the year 2026. It provides schools and/or local educational agencies not using myON currently the means to do so by using the state's shared account.

"I encourage every parent and student to use this **free service** to continue to read over the holidays," Thurmond said in a statement. "This is a great opportunity for our families to share the joy of reading and establish routines that support literacy growth for our students. We hope that free access to thousands of digital books will create and cultivate a lifelong love of reading that can continue to be nurtured by our school and local libraries." [Learn more...](#)

## Home Language Network Survey Results

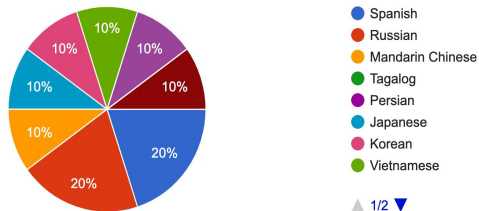

### Senate Bill 130

- » Universalizes access to TK for all four-year-olds in the state
- » Phased in over four years
- » Requires one teacher for every 12 students beginning 2022-23

Money available to expand current TK program.

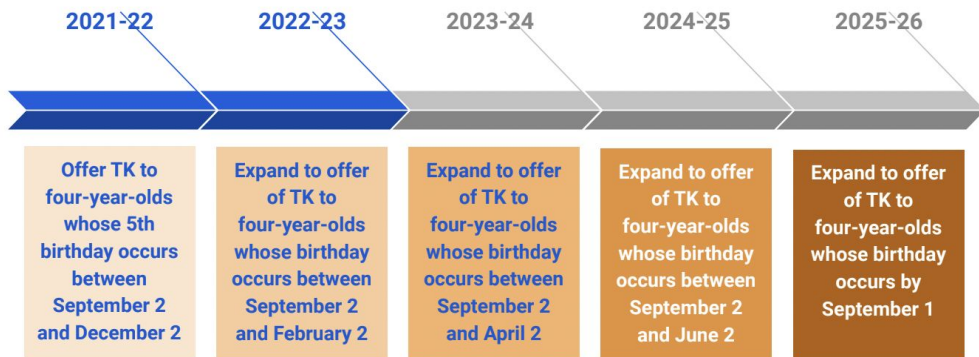
Next year required to include an additional two months for students who will turn 5. Extended to qualify four year olds who fall between September 2- February 2, birthdays.

Student to adult ratio will be quite small, half of what it is right now.

- We don't receive ADA until students turn 5

## Legal Requirements of Universal TK

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Education Code Sections (EC 48000(c)(1)(C)-(G))

## Educator Effectiveness Block Grant Fund (EEF)

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- » Assembly Bill 130
- » The EEF may be used to support professional learning for certificated teachers, administrators, paraprofessional educators, and certificated staff.
- » Allowable use of funds (10 Strategies) over the next four years
- » **Total Allocation: \$592,038**

## Expanded Learning Opportunity Programs Funding 10

- » Per Assembly Bill 130, the ELO-P provides funding for afterschool and summer school enrichment programs for TK through sixth grade.
- » Before school, after school, summer, or intersession learning programs that focus on developing the academic, social, emotional, and physical needs and interests of pupils through hands-on, engaging learning experiences.
- » Programs are pupil-centered, results driven, include community partners, and complement, but do not replicate, learning activities in the regular school day and school year.

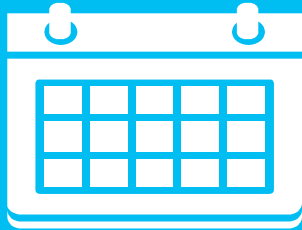
We will be working with the board on how this money will be used. The district needs to submit a plan to the state on how we will use it. Challenging to find the qualified people to run the programs.
