



Reclassification to Fluent English Proficient (RFEP)	CSD's Goal for RFEP Rate is 15% per year.  Great news! CSD Average RFEP Rate over the last 5 years is 17.18% 2015-2016= 16.7% 2016- 2017= 28.7% 2017-2018= 13.8% 2018-2019= 12.4% 2019- 2020= 14.3%

	With the adoption of the new ELA/ELD Curriculum of Benchmark for Elementary and HMH Collections for middle school, we anticipate that the percentage of students RFEP will accelerate.
	March 13th is our last District PD date for teachers: (Elementary teachers will focus on the ELD component of Benchmark Advance)

## **Supplemental Funding**

- **Title I** funding has been
  - We currently use Free/Reduced fundings to allocate funding (Socioeconomically disadvantaged students)
  - Funding Allocation from the state is also based on census, housing values, gas prices, and income tax reporting and that determines how much funding Cambrian receives (Anticipated for \$163,523 and now we received an update and now we only have 100,819- a difference of \$62,704)
  - Cambrian has now fallen under the 5% threshold for Title I (predicted to be at 3%)

	<ul> <li>Title III was reduced by \$4,798 (English Learner Supports and Loaner technology program)</li> <li>There was an increase in Title IV \$10,000 to \$12,151- an increase of 2,151 (Supported Project Lead the Way and Seal of Biliteracy Pathway)</li> <li>Approximately \$75,000 cut to our programs and services in the current year.</li> </ul>
New LCAP Template	<ul> <li>The state revised the template to make it easier but it doesn't happen without extra work.</li> <li>It will help ensure that funding allocation is properly distributed and shows the impact it is having on our students.</li> <li>What is the LCAP for?
