This has been an incredible 2021-22 school year in our district, and I am so very proud of our students, staff, and families. We have been thrilled to be back in the classroom all year long, and our students have achieved so much in their studies.

### **NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS**

I can't begin to list all the achievements of this past school year— there is not enough room. But suffice to say that our students and schools have experienced great success in academics, extracurricular programs, and more.

Some of our campuses have been updated by wonderful volunteers with new trees (Bagby), students planting in gardening beds (Fammatre) and murals and general beautification (Sartorette), and will only improve more with this summer's construction. Farnham held an amazing Science Fair recently with 168 students participating. This school year, Steindorf STEAM students were featured on NBC Bay Area television and in the San Jose Mercury News for their outstanding project-based learning unit on monarch butterflies, and several students were recognized for high honors in a national math competition (see page 3).

We were honored and thrilled that **Price Middle School** has been selected for the 2022 Glenn Hoffmann Exemplary Program Award, presented by the Santa Clara County School Boards Association. Also, Price eighth-grader, **Camille Quinard**, performed a piano recital at world-renowned Carnegie Hall in New York, as the winner of the Elite International Music Competition. Way to go!

### Two Students Rank Nationally in Math Competition

Two Steindorf STEAM School eighth graders earned scores that ranked nationally in the AMC 8 Math Competition, a multiple choice exam in middle school math designed to promote the development of problem-solving skills.

Nationally, **Leonid Chernyakhovskiy** scored in the top 1% and **Amber Lin** scored in the top 5%. Over 65,000 students nationally took part in the AMC 8 this year. ## **CSD School Board President**

First, thank you for being such great supporters of Cambrian. From family involvement in our schools, to supporting bond measures, Cambrian has always been there. In turn, the Trustees of the Cambrian School Board want to ensure we keep that trust. In order to do so, we are working hard to maintain a stellar education program, including the arts, music, and PE, along with strong academics, while working to build and maintain a balanced budget. As you may be aware, that is no easy feat with state and federal dollars not coming close to covering the cost of educating our students.

Thanks to your support of Measure R, five out of our six schools will be getting new HVAC systems. That's 150 classrooms that will be done over the summer. Aging portables will be replaced by permanent classrooms at four of our sites next summer. There are many projects that will be done over the next four years including new ceilings, lights, windows, water and gas lines, and more.

To ensure a more stable future level of funding, the Board approved the development of the property at Metzler School, which you may know as ATLC. The school will remain, but the surrounding land will include new housing and a memory care facility. The agreement will provide ongoing revenue for many years to come.

Also, Cambrian now offers before and after school care and is expanding TK. There are so many exciting things going on in Cambrian; it's too much for this newsletter. If you are interested in learning more, please visit www.cambriansd.org.
