STUDENTS

Widespread Rewards and Recognition

- I. The award system in the school should be
 - A. Widespread and an integral part of the daily and special activities of the school.
 - B. Designed to reinforce important school goals, especially academic work.
 - C. Often made in a public manner.

- II. There are multiple opportunities for rewards and recognition:
 - A. Academic rewards are the highest rewards in school.
 - B. Academic rewards are based on performance and effort.
 - C. Rewards are given for meaningful participation in school activities.
 - D. Rewards are given for citizenship and service.
 - E. Students earn rewards frequently.
 - F. A high percentage of students receive rewards.

- III. The reward program is systematic:
 - A. Procedures and criteria for rewards are specified and students are aware of the reward system.
 - B. The reward system is coordinated between the classroom and the school.
 - C. Rewards are an integral part of the daily classroom activity.
 - D. Rewards are an integral part of the school activity.
 - E. Types of rewards are varied.

IV. Public rewards/recognition are prevalent:

- A. The school uses many public methods of recognizing its students.
- B. Public recognition is conducted in a spirit of pomp and ceremony.
- C. Separate rewards and reward opportunities are available for students as they progress to higher grades.
