Chronic Infectious Disease Not Known to be Transmitted by Casual Contact

The Governing Board acknowledges that district schools may be confronted with serving pupils in a chronic state of infectious disease not known to be transmitted by casual contact. In such cases, the Board is committed to provide these pupils with an uninterrupted education in the least restrictive setting.

For each child known to have such a chronic infectious disease, the Board directs the Superintendent to appoint a separate review committee whose function will be to determine the most appropriate educational setting. Each review committee shall include, but not be limited to: the parents, the child's health care provider, a school nurse, a medical or public health consultant, a school administrator, and the child's current teacher.

Criteria to be considered by each review committee in arriving at a recommendation for the type of educational setting for the child with a chronic infectious disease shall include, but not be limited to: the age, behavior, and neurological development of the child; the physical condition of the child; the health and safety of others; and guidelines of the National Center for Disease Control.
