- I. Welcome - Jill Brigham - call to order at 7:02 pm
  - A. 19 parents present
  
- II. Approval of September 10, 2019 Minutes - Christine Kouvaris
  - A. Motion by Tracy Stamp to approve minutes, second by Erika Foss, all in favor, approved.
  
- III. CUHSD Presentation - Sarah Foy, Coordinator of Community Engagement & Communications
  - A. Video presentation
  - B. CUHSD Quick Facts
    1. District serves about 8,300 students at 5 sites plus one
    2. 78% of 2018 graduates were enrolled in college, highest level ever (about 1,400 students)
    3. Bond measure funds - within the last two years, they have completed about 50% of construction projects
      - a) Two story classroom buildings at Leigh and Branham, needed to expand the site and classrooms due to increased enrollment
      - b) New furniture to all sites
      - c) New swimming pools to all sites
    4. Bond measure funds cannot be used for funding teacher salaries or mental health support
    5. Projecting a 6% increase over the next five years
      - a) Majority of funding comes from property taxes and is not based on a per student basis
    6. District Office land redevelopment initiative - will repurpose land where the district office sits to create more funding options for the district
    7. May look to increase the parcel tax next year in order to increase revenue for the district
