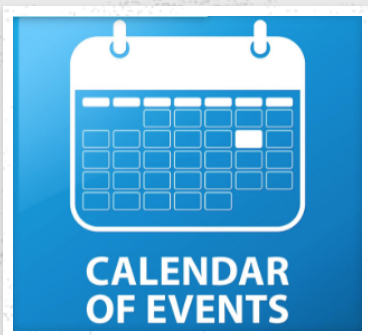

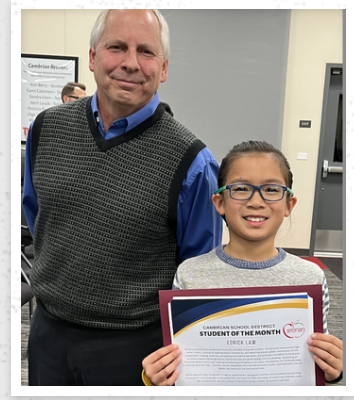
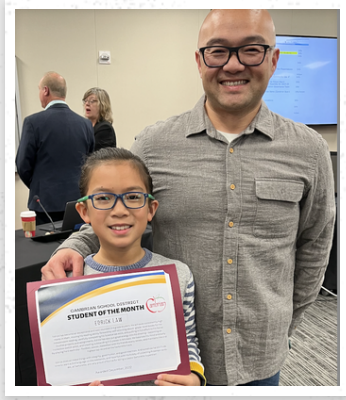

**This Month's Book for K-5h: The Day You Begin by Jacqueline Woodson.**

This book provides opportunities for conversations around tolerance and acceptance of others. It also makes us aware about the importance of creating a caring school climate where everyone feels they belong.

**To reinforce the message at home:** Brainstorm ideas to do intentional acts of caring for family, friends, and neighbors. Choose one or two to do together. s Give positive reinforcement to your child for actions and remarks that show empathy and compassion for others.

**This Month's Book for TK, SDC TK-K and SDC 1-2: How to Hide a Lion by Helen Stephens.** This book empowers young children to learn that they can help someone and also know that there are caring adults in their lives who keep them safe. This month's ABC book: **"The Day You Begin"** by Jacqueline Woodson promotes tolerance and acceptance of others.


**Goals of lesson:**

1. Students learn to **embrace and nurture each individual** for who they are.
2. Students learn how to **recognize and value all dimensions of diversity**.
3. Students will practice **inclusive behaviors to create a caring school climate** where every child is safe.

**We hope you will talk with your child tonight** about The Day You Begin to reinforce the message at home!

- **Brainstorm** ideas to do intentional acts of caring for family, friends and neighbors. Choose one or two to do together.
- **Questions to discuss** with your child:
  1. How are the other families different/ the same from ours?
  2. What can we say or do to make everyone feel they are respected and valued in our community?
  3. Why is it important to always respectfully agree to disagree?
- As a family, discuss your views about equality and social justice. Consider choosing a cause to follow and help. Research shows that children benefit from a sense of empowerment when they successfully address societal issues that might otherwise seem overwhelming.

**PROJECT CORNERSTONE**

**This December, in Mrs. Param, Jones and Ghirarducci's classes**

Our wonderful Project Cornerstone volunteer team met **How to Make a Lion** by Helen Stephens. This book is about a lion who named his and a lion, and he and his lion develop an unlikely friendship in front of his unloving parents. In his, play and care for him until they are discovered and lion escapes. This story empowers young children to learn that they can help someone and also know that there are caring adults in their lives who keep them safe.


The secret category for this book is Empowerment. Empowerment lets young children know and that they belong and are welcomed into their family, school, and community. It is important to reassure children that adults are caring for them, so that they feel safe. This creates a sense of personal power that builds self-esteem, empathy, responsibility, and self-regulation.

Here are some ways to build the safety asset:

- Teach them important information - he/she's full name, your full name, address and phone number.
- Designate **safe adults** who you someone that is always safe to go to. Tell your child and their teachers who the safe adults are. (Be sure to tell the **safe adults** that they have been named a **safe adult**.)
- Show to your child if someone makes them feel scared, they should always tell a **safe adult**, even if the scary person says it is a secret and not to tell anyone.
- If someone hurt you, teach your child to yell out your name. Then go to a teacher, a parent or a woman with children for help. Practice by role playing.

Young children are made to feel empowered by being included in service to others and gaining useful skills in the world around them. When we help children act on their ideas and find ways to help others, we empower them. Some ways to build this are:

  - Spend time with your child. Read books, play games, and explore the outdoors. Tap in to their interests. This lets them know that you think they are important.

  - Find ways all children can contribute to the family. Instead of chores call them family contributions.
  - Have your child help you with your child for friends and family members.
  - Ask preschoolers to make cards or gather donations to send to the sick.
  - Invite preschoolers to help make food for others.



# CORPORATE MATCHING

**Frequently Asked Questions**

1. What is corporate matching?  
Many companies match their employees' contributions to non-profit organizations. In the United States, a non-profit organization that is permitted to offer tax-deductible donations is also called a 501(c)(3) organization.

Many companies will even allow you to choose if you want your donation matched one time or, if you have a donation directed to the HSC from each paycheck, they will match each withdrawal as well!

2. Do you have to be a parent to corporate match?  
No! Employers will match any charitable giving that an employee makes to non-profit 501(c)(3) entities. Extended family and friends are always able to check with their own employers to see if they match their donations!

3. Does corporate matching benefit me or my student?  
Yes! By helping the HSC achieve its financial goals for the year you are helping support the teachers, staff and students. Please click here to see more about what the HSC does at Santorette Elementary. In addition, the IRS allows donations to non-profit 501(c)(3) organizations to be eligible for deduction on your taxes.

4. By corporate matching does that mean my coworkers will know what I donated?  
Absolutely not! Companies keep corporate matching data totally private. No one has access to this information or can

see how much other employees donated. In most cases, companies outsource the entire process so your coworkers would not even be able to access the data.

5. When should I apply for corporate matching?  
As soon as you make your donation. Some employers distribute their matching funds right away, some do it on each pay period, some are monthly while others only distribute once per quarter or less. The sooner you apply, the sooner your matching funds can be put to work bettering our school!

It is also important to remember that some companies require matching requests be made within a set time frame after the initial donation. If your company matches your gifts, please apply for it right away.

6. Does my employer even have a corporate matching program?  
Each year, the Santorette Elementary HSC receives donations from many employers. If your employer is not listed here you can search by company name by [CLICKING HERE](#) and typing in your employer. If you still are not sure then please contact the HR/Benefits department or look on your company intranet to see if matching is available and how to apply for the match.
