

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Sartorette MakerSpace

Started in the 2018-2019 school year the Sartorette Home and School Club is proud to have a new dedicated MakerSpace that will be available for all students.

What is a MakerSpace? MakerSpaces provide creative time and space for students to build, prototype, explore questions, fail and retry, use materials in a new way, become ideas off one another and build something together. They are designed with the thought that students need to be able to think critically, problem-solve and collaborate in order to succeed in the future they will inhabit.

What are some examples of learning experiences during class MakerSpace time or lunch MakerSpace time?
Maker Challenges, Story Circles, "Make it & Take it", Legos, Tinker Toys, wooden blocks, K'Nex, Holey Moley, Sphero Bolt & Indy, ceramics and ephemeral art just to name a few!

Where do we get our materials?
We depend upon donated & new materials donated from our community to keep costs minimal, as well as support from our HSC to purchase tools and devices to power our creations.

What are the rules and expectations in the MakerSpace?

1. Be creative, take risks, try something new, transform the materials.
2. Be respectful of the tools, materials & volunteers.
3. When working outside, be respectful of classes in session.
4. Keep the materials organized and only take what you need to work in class.
5. CLEAN UP, CLEAN UP, CLEAN UP!
6. Try it forward! Teach others and share your learning.
7. If you don't follow the MakerSpace rules and expectations during Lunchtime MakerSpace, you will be asked to leave and need to earn the right to come back.

"Plan. Persevere. Put it Away."

When can students participate in MakerSpace?

During class time with their teacher or during lunch time (once volunteers are allowed back on campus).

Prior to participating each year, all teachers and classes must watch an orientation video made by the MakerSpace Team. After watching this orientation, teachers can sign up for class time slots and can put their students on the list for lunchtime MakerSpace.

Who can participate?
All students in grades Pre-K-5 after their class has watched a MakerSpace orientation.

How can I help?

1. **Donate Supplies!** Look at our Supply Wish List and donate supplies at the blue MakerSpace box in front of the office or purchase supplies from our Amazon wish list.
2. **Volunteer!**
 - a. Help maintain the MakerSpace
 - b. Supervise Lunchtime MakerSpace
 - c. Work with your child's teacher during class MakerSpace time
 - d. Prep supplies for the MakerSpace




Completed forms will determine Title and supplemental funding for Sartorette and the Cambrian School District. Refer to [Cambrian Food Services Department](#) for more information.

Based on Free/Reduced eligibility, this funding supports:

- Title I funds - Counseling, intervention, and Reading/Math support
- Title II funds - Professional Development for all staff
- Title III funds - Immigration and English Learner students
- Title IV funds - Middle School support for English Learners
- Supplemental funds - Intervention, Teacher Aides, Counseling Services, Psychologist Services, Community Liaisons, Software Licenses for students, Teacher Instructional Support, and Instructional materials






SUPERSTARS "MEET" STEPH CURRY!
