Committee Reports

Paragon - Kristin & Traci Catt - Sales are underway. Goal is for every student to sell 5 items. Keep encouraging the sales. Order forms are due on Tuesday, September 26th. Delivery of items is October 25th. We will need volunteers to help. Sign up genius will be coming soon.

Teacher Appreciation - Staff Appreciation committee met and discussed ideas and task list for the year. Upcoming: Parent Teacher conferences. Parents can sign up and bring in food to the conference room on Sept. 27th and Oct. 4th.

Marketing - Committee Meeting Update, Katie Spond - Committee met and discussed ideas. How can we increase our volunteer base? Use sign up genius as a portal to house all available volunteer opportunities and allow parents to sign up anytime? To help promote Raise Right, we'd like to dedicate 1 parent just to work on that. Maybe have a support booth at Leadership Night to help parents get started setting it up and using it. For the PTO newsletter do we use a dedicated service (mailchimp, etc.) vs. an email attachment? Make PTO thank you cards with our logo that have tax deductible information included that we can send to donors. Katie Spond made volunteer buttons so our volunteers can wear them while working at events. Promote Papa Johns (JASPER30) by sending home a flier for a family pizza night. Boost apparel sales by having JES news anchors wear shirts and gear, have QR code available so parents can easily order from their phone. Use school reach text messages sometimes in lieu of phone calls. Discussed the current PE program and the lack of a dedicated PE teacher and ideas on how to incorporate more movement in the classroom. Possibly utilize FitFuel to make videos for teachers to use with their class.

Welcome & Culture Committee - Mural, Nicole Lampert is working with Blondebrush on a wall mural. Teachers will get to vote on a design. Then it will need to be approved by school board. JES culture committee is also working with Blondebrush on a window mural for library. Use Giving Tuesday to help fund these projects. More at the November meeting.

Budget Amendments and Fund Requests



Upgrade Grant & Stipend Request - Mrs. Schnaus - Upgrade is an organization that grants money to provide health and wellness initiatives. It started at 5th street. They gave \$20,000 for the tot lot (preK and K playground), have provided recess & PE equipment and curriculum. Kamasia and Kevin Schipp are the coordinators. They put in extra time organizing & implementing initiatives (Wildcat Walk, recess & PE equipment, fresh fruit & veggie choices at lunch, healthy birthday menu, Minds in Motion, etc.) Upgrade will give them \$500 to split if the school matches it. Kamasia asked if PTO could pay the \$500. Voted on providing \$500 for the match. Vote passed unanimously.

Substitute Appreciation Bags - Need to discuss details with Mrs. Small and how much money would be needed for this. This would likely come out of the Staff Appreciation budget.

JES Book Fair, Library & AR Points
