Make sure your student is :


- 1. Completing required high school credits

- 4. Avoiding last minute problems grades, attendance, behavior

CCMR- How Does This Benefit My Student???

- CCMR stands for College, Career, Military Readiness
- MISD is wanting to ensure that all students graduate college, career, and/or military ready and are prepared to pursue their post-secondary plans successfully.
- There are several different ways to be deemed CCMR ready and counselors are tracking this information on every senior.
- You will be receiving notice from the counselor if your student has not yet obtained their CCMR point along with information on how they can earn this point.
- We want all of our seniors to graduate College, Career, and/or Military ready, so please help us to encourage your students to obtain this designation.

Classification of Students

- Students must have 19 credits at the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year to be classified as a senior.
- If your student does not have 19 credits, your child's counselor will meet with him/her at the beginning of the school year to discuss credit recovery options.



College Application Tips

- 1. Application on ApplyTexas, Common App, etc
- 2. Send high school transcript or complete self-report, if applicable
- 3. Send SAT and/or ACT score (from college board or ACT website)
- 4. Pay application fee or apply for fee waiver

Show:

- 2. Grade Point Average (GPA)
- 3. Class Rank
- 4. Graduation Plan

 Student must show an ID
 48 hour turn around time
 First 10 are free then \$2.00 each

End of Course Exams (EOC)

Students must pass or be waived for the following EOC's to graduate: English 1 English 2 Algebra 1 Biology US History

TESTING SAT - measures general verbal, mathematical reasoning, and writing skills ACT - measures more closely to high school curricula

Junior colleges do not require ACT or SAT for enrollment

Exemptions from TSI: For information about whether you are exempt from testing, contact either the testing office or the advising office at the Texas college or university you currently attend or plan to attend.
