grades, attendance, behavior

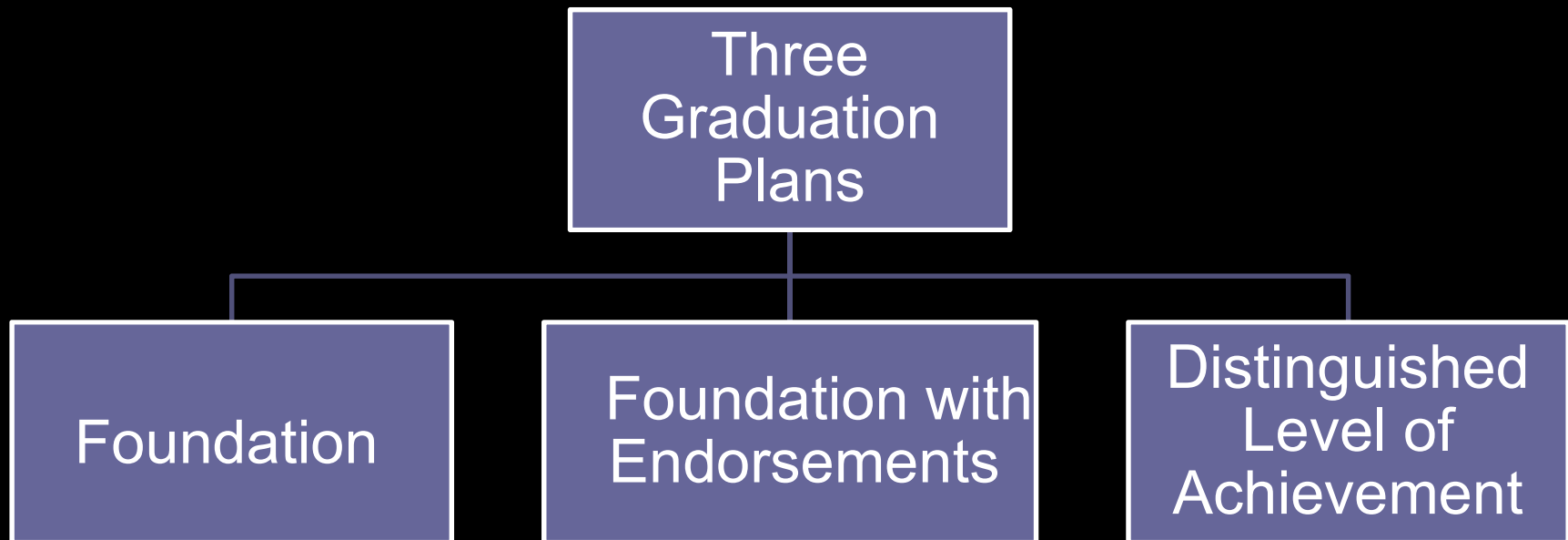
CCMR- How Does This Benefit My Student???

- CCMR stands for College, Career, Military Readiness
-
- MISD is wanting to ensure that all students graduate college, career, and/or military ready and are prepared to pursue their post-secondary plans successfully.
 - There are several different ways to be deemed CCMR ready and counselors are tracking this information on every senior.
 - You will be receiving notice from the counselor if your student has not yet obtained their CCMR point along with information on how they can earn this point.
 - We want all of our seniors to graduate College, Career, and/or Military ready, so please help us to encourage your students to obtain this designation.

Classification of Students

- Students must have 19 credits at the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year to be classified as a senior.
- If your student does not have 19 credits, your child's counselor will meet with him/her at the beginning of the school year to discuss credit recovery options.

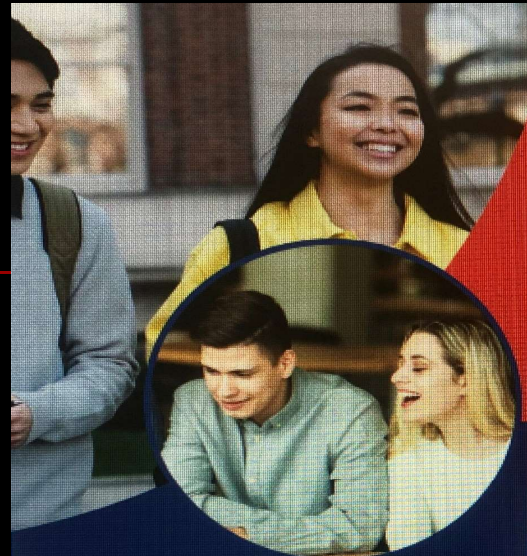


Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA)

- Must have a 4th science
- Fulfills requirements for most 4 year colleges and universities.
- Must fulfill DLA requirement to be eligible for state's top 10% automatic admission

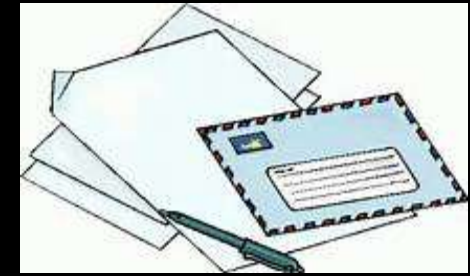
What to expect:

College Application Tips

1. Application on ApplyTexas, Common App, etc
2. Send high school transcript or complete self-report, if applicable
3. Send SAT and/or ACT score (from college board or ACT website)
4. Pay application fee or apply for fee waiver

Letter of Recommendation



- Please allow 2 weeks notice
- Give the recommender a detailed resume which includes work experience, leadership positions, volunteer hours and hardships you have overcome along with post secondary plans
- Choose a teacher that knows you well and can speak to your character
- Should I waive FERPA?

- Fee waivers are available only for students who qualify for free or reduced lunch.

TESTING

TSI - must be taken prior to enrolling in a Texas college, university.

Exemptions from TSI: For information about whether you are exempt from testing, contact either the testing office or the advising office at the Texas college or university you currently attend or plan to attend.
