Colegio San Ignacio de Loyola is in a suburban area of San Juan, the capital of Puerto Rico. Our school is a Jesuit, Catholic college preparatory school that seeks to form young men of competence, conscience, commitment, and compassion. Through our academic, athletic, co-curricular, spiritual, and service programs, we challenge our students to become young men of integrity, faith, and justice, committed to academic excellence and service for others.

We are a Jesuit school, a learning community that offers a comprehensive, catholic education of excellence. We evangelize by educating young men and their families and by serving as a bridge between diverse contexts, to promote a sustainable world in which human relations are solidary, just, and fraternal, for the Greater Glory of God.

DEMOGRAPHICS

CSI enrolls 520 students from seventh to twelve grades, and currently has a Senior Class of 104 students. Twenty-seven percent of our students receive financial assistance. Our faculty consists of 47 teachers, 6 counselors, 1 social worker, 1 learning specialist, and 26 administrators. We have a highly qualified faculty with 70% of its members holding a master's degree or a doctoral degree. The faculty-student ratio is 9:1.

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HOW HAS THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC IMPACTED OUR SENIOR CLASS?

Our school prepared a strong and comprehensive COVID-19 Plan aligned with our mission and philosophy. School health safety procedures and protocols implemented during seniors' 9th and 10th grade experiences included virtual learning, adjusted community service hours, and limited extracurricular events and activities (clubs and sports). Even though our COVID-19 Plan proved to be effective and aided in the transition of students to campus for on-site classes, we observed deficiencies in specific academic skills, and addressed socioemotional issues related to isolation.

CSI provides final grades by semester. The first semester goes from August to December and the second semester from January to May. Final letter grades are converted to numerical grade points to calculate the cumulative grade point average (GPA).

ABOUT ADVANCED, HONORS, AND AP **COURSES**

In 7th grade students are placed in levels based on their grades and admission exams. Academic levels include regular, advanced (for Math), honor, and AP courses. After 8th grade core course placement is based on each student's academic performance and teachers' recommendations. Honors Math, English, and Spanish track begin in 7th grade and the Science and Social Studies honor tracks begin in 8th grade. We encourage our students to follow an academic program aligned with their interests and abilities. Our AP courses begin in 10th grade. Our students' school bell schedule allows them to take a maximum of 2 AP courses per year. The Class of 2024 has shown a high academic profile; 75 of the 104 students seniors have at least 1 AP course. According to our school's statistics, our current seniors have taken an average number of 3 AP courses.

100% of our students continue to colleges and universities in Puerto Rico and the United States. Our Class of 2023: 68% of the graduates decided to study in the U.S., 31 % of the graduates chose to study in Puerto Rico and 1% went to Spain.
