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The Strength of Our History

Founded in 1969, Solomon Schechter Academy (SSA) is proud to be the largest mainstream private Jewish elementary and preschool in Montreal. Educating more than 400 children annually, Solomon Schechter Academy lays the foundation for a lifetime of learning and instills a passion for excellence and Jewish traditions. The Academy's educational process is a vibrant partnership between students, parents, and educators, beginning with Junior Pre-K at age three, continuing through elementary school graduation at age twelve.

The Academy's strong foundation originated from its roots as the Shaare Zion Academy (1951-1969), continuously evolving to meet the educational needs of the contemporary Jewish community. In the early 1970's, a French-immersion stream was created, later becoming a full "section française", which today offers all students, including those with English eligibility, the tremendous opportunity to learn in a French-immersion environment.




Over time, SSA's facilities have also expanded beyond the many bright and spacious classrooms.

The **Amiel Early Childhood Centre** was inaugurated in 2013 and provides our youngest students in preschool and Kindergarten the formative indoor and outdoor spaces in which to learn and grow. The Azrieli SMART Floor, together with the Beverley and Harvey Greenberg Makerspace, allow students of the Academy to explore their creativity and develop the skills needed for future success in the science and technology fields and in the arts. This includes coding, robotics, 3D design, music, visual arts, computer animation, video production, and more. The state-of-the-art Sondra & Martin Schwartz Family Gymnasium, as well as brand new playgrounds on both campuses, enable each child to enjoy sports on a daily basis and to pursue higher levels of athletics and wellness.

The heart of a Solomon Schechter Academy education remains its Judaic Studies and commitment to developing strong Jewish values and a love for Israel within each student. Highlights include *Tikkun Olam* activities for all age levels, the annual model *Seders* and *Chagigot*, the *Bnot Sherut* and *Shinshin* programs, through which we welcome inspiring Israeli youth to spend the year with us at SSA, and the Grade 6 trip to Israel, an incredible program unique to SSA. While academic excellence has long been a cornerstone of SSA, the nature of learning has changed dramatically in recent years.

We are a school of choice for diverse learners, knowing that no two children learn in the same manner, and that social-emotional wellbeing goes hand-in-hand with success in learning. The Academy's team of teachers, teaching assistants, resource and clinical specialists work together and with SSA families, so that each child may reach their full potential, receiving the extra support and enrichment they need to succeed.

Today's Solomon Schechter Academy is an inclusive environment, welcoming families from diverse socio-economic and cultural backgrounds who practice a variety of Jewish traditions, reflecting the unique mosaic of Montreal and enriching the community that is SSA. We are proud to be Montreal's leading elementary school and look forward to reaching new heights in the years to come.

A Plan for Our Future

With a strong history and mission as our guide, in 2022 we undertook the goal of delivering a fresh and relevant Strategic Plan to guide Solomon Schechter Academy from 2023-2026.

Formulating such a plan was an ambitious endeavour, led by the Strategic Planning Committee, and supported by many stakeholder groups in the SSA community. Current and past parents, staff members, and recent alumni shared their first-hand experiences through confidential surveys, while open-forum discussions held with current parents, and a review of feedback from prospective future parents, established common themes which helped to form the key priorities for the strategic plan.

From these priorities, a new vision and a **four-pillar strategic plan** was established.

The Academy's mission remains, as well as the six core values established during the previous strategic plan. Each pillar includes a number of related priorities and commitments to our community. The administration, strategic planning committee, and Board of Trustees have identified the tasks and key performance indicators that are required in order to achieve the priorities of each pillar within the strategic plan. Progress will be measured regularly throughout each school year and reported to the community annually.

The four strategic pillars that will inform our focus over the next three years are further elaborated upon within this plan. They are:

Excellent Multilingual Education with a Whole-Child Approach

Solomon Schechter Academy's dedication to excellence extends beyond academic achievement to encompass the holistic development of every child. Through a whole-child approach to education, we are committed to creating a learning environment that nurtures students' social-emotional, physical, and cognitive growth, preparing them to thrive as engaged citizens and successful contributors to our global community.

Academic success and excellence have long been hallmarks of SSA's reputation and are universally recognized among our stakeholders as underlying the Academy's identity and purpose, moving forward. The tools each student needs to achieve success and prepare for life beyond SSA, differs for each child. A fundamental goal of Solomon Schechter Academy is to **prepare our students to excel** in whatever path they may choose going forward, providing each child the tools and the opportunities to become bilingual leaders who can thrive in Quebec, Canada, and around the world.

- Enhancing our French curriculum with a focus on oral communication skills.
- Reviewing our trilingual pedagogical model to enhance student learning by providing a full spectrum of support and enrichment.
- Developing innovative ways to deliver our Judaic Studies curriculum and program.
- Investing in our STEAM curriculum by integrating it across other subject areas and leveraging new technology and materials for creative learning.
- Modernizing our classrooms to support active learning models with flexible seating and a variety of tools and resources.
- Providing unique opportunities for students' to showcase their accomplishments, achievements, and skills.

As a school community, we are committed to instilling the Jewish values of *Derech Eretz* - respect, responsibility, and integrity - into the fabric of everything we do.
