- ☐ See Financial Aid Advisor, Becky Phillips, in Room 110C at CTC. (Find out about deadline dates at: <http://www.uaf.edu/register/process/dates-and-deadlines/>).
- ☐ Apply for Admission: <https://www.ctc.uaf.edu/get-started/apply/>. This is required for financial assistance. (\$40 fee for certificate or associate programs OR \$50 fee for bachelor programs) *For active duty military using tuition assistance, see your Education Center.
- ☐ Send official copy of college transcripts from previous college(s) to UAF (uaf-admissions@alaska.edu). Discuss transfer credits with an Advisor. Unofficial transcripts can be brought to advising appointment.
- ☐ Discuss academic plan with Academic Advisor then complete Registration Form listing classes to take. Turn in Registration Form to the CTC Student Assistance Office to complete pre-registration process.
- ☐ Register for classes at UAOnline. (<http://uaonline.alaska.edu>).
- ☐ Read about the waitlist process, if applicable, at: <https://www.uaf.edu/reg/records-registration/waitlisting.php> (If a class is waitlisted, you will NOT automatically be placed on the waitlist.)
- ☐ Get a Polar Express card 2 weeks before the semester starts from CTC or Signer's Hall in the Bursar's Office. (This is your permanent official university identification card. Bring valid photo identification).
- ☐ Pay for a Parking Decal from CTC or Signer's Hall in the Bursar's Office, if applicable.

Scholarship Tips

- **UA Foundation Scholarships** - This one application puts UA students in the running for over 450 scholarships. It can be accessed via UAOnline under the "Financial Aid" link. You must have applied to UA to access the scholarship application. Feb. 15 is the general deadline, but there are some scholarships awarded later in the year, so you should always complete it.
- **Alaska Community Foundation** – <https://alaskacf.org/scholarships/> has many CTC major related scholarships.
- **Look Locally First** – Family affiliated employers, clubs and organizations, churches, unions, utilities, and local organizations related to your major often offer scholarships. Local scholarships generally receive fewer applications.
- **Then Look Nationally** – National organizations related to your major often offer scholarships. A Google search can help you ID these organizations. There is also a scholarship book in the CTC financial office.
- **Utilize AKCIS.Org** – This state of AK career and education site that has an awesome scholarship search. Use USERNAME: uafctc and PASSWORD: 4Student. Hover over "Education" at the top of the page, select "Financial Aid Sort" to the right under "How do I Find Financial Aid". Be sure to select "Continue" at the bottom of the page to include all of your demographics.
- **Search High School Websites** – Most high schools have an excellent list of scholarships on their counseling websites. Be sure to check out counseling websites in high schools and school districts other than your own.
- **Military Affiliated** – Check out <http://search.militaryscholar.org/> Includes scholarships for Military and Veteran dependents, descendants and for the members themselves. Spouses clubs often have scholarships as well.

FAFSA Tips

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) opens Oct. 1

This happens every academic year. Students attending college in fall 2020 will be able to complete their FAFSA as early as Oct. 1, 2019.

Complete your FAFSA early!

State grants are on a first come first served basis. The earlier you complete your FAFSA, the more likely you are to receive need based state aid.

The FAFSA uses tax information from 2 years prior.

The 19/20 FAFSA requires 2017 tax information. The 20/21 FAFSA requires 2018 tax information.

Students MUST complete their FAFSA by June 30 of each year to be Alaska Performance Scholarship eligible.

How to Apply for Federal Financial Aid

- The Free Application for Federal Student Aid is commonly known as the FAFSA. The FAFSA evaluates a student's eligibility for both federal grants and loans. It is also used by the state and many scholarship organizations to determine eligibility for their programs as well.
- If you have never completed the FAFSA, you will need to create an FSA ID. You can do this at **FSAID.ED.GOV**. Be sure to provide a cell phone number for username/password recovery in case you forget them in the future.
- If you have completed a FAFSA in the past, but can't remember your user name or password you can retrieve it on FSAID.ED.GOV by using the "Manage My FSA ID" tab.
- Parents of dependent students also need to create an FSA ID, and provide their financial information on the FAFSA. Most students under the age of 24 are considered dependent for financial aid purposes. If you are unsure about your dependency status you can go to **studentaid.gov/dependency** to learn more.
- After you have created your FSA ID, go to **FAFSA.ED.GOV** and complete the FAFSA. For the school year that includes summer 2020 you will need to complete the 1920 FAFSA using your 2017 tax and income information. For the school year beginning with fall 2020 you will use 2018 tax information to complete the FAFSA.
- You can send your FAFSA to up to 10 schools. UAF's school code is 001063.
- Be sure to sign AND submit your FAFSA.
- You will receive an e-mail from federal student aid (FSA) a few days after you submit your FAFSA telling you the information has been sent to your school. It generally takes 5-7 days before your school actually receives this information.
- Be sure to check in with your school's financial aid office a week after you submit the FAFSA. About 1/3 of FAFSA applicants are chosen for a process called "verification". During this process the Department of Education requests additional information from the student. Your school can't see your financial aid until this process is complete so it is important to get the requested information to them as soon as possible.

- Academic advisors should check test score and prerequisite course dates on BANNER or UAOnline and instruct students to retest if their test scores are more than ONE year old for the placement test date and TWO years old for the course prerequisite date. Students who enroll in any course without meeting placement or prerequisite requirements may be dropped or withdrawn by the instructor.
- Completion of MATH F068 will meet the requirements needed to enter MATH F105, MATH F071, MATH F105N.
- MATH F051 is appropriate for students needing a review of basic math skills.
- MATH F065 assists students in reviewing and reinforcing course concepts covered by MATH F054, MATH F055, MATH F062, MATH F105(N).
- Students in consultation with their academic advisor or course instructor, may opt to take a course lower than their placement.
- Placement for General Education Requirement Natural Science courses require WRTG F111X placement as well as placement listed above, except those with placement higher than what this table gives (e.g. PHYS F211X, PHYS F212X, PHYS F213X).

No ALEKS testing is required for ECE 117 or HUMS 117.

ACCUPLACER Placement Testing

What is the ACCUPLACER Placement Test?

The ACCUPLACER placement test is a computerized version that assesses skills in reading, writing and math. It is used to help determine student success and readiness for specific course work. All entering associate degree and certificate students are required to provide test scores in reading and writing from the Next-Generation ACCUPLACER, ASSET, ACT or SAT placement tests. Students planning to take a 100-level written communication course need to place into the course from one of these placement tests.

Note: None of the math sections of the Next-Generation ACCUPLACER will be administered. Instead, the ALEKS placement test will be required for math placement.

Should I Practice before taking the ACCUPLACER Test? YES!!

Practicing your writing and reading comprehension skills before taking the ACCUPLACER test is strongly encouraged! You can improve your test scores and reduce the number of preparatory classes needed saving you money!

Writing Placement Table 2019-2020

Placement into writing (WRTG) courses requires either prerequisite course credit or a standardized placement test that measures academic skills such as critical thinking and reading. The score from any of the tests places the student in the appropriate writing class. A writing sample, given on the first day of class, may modify this placement. Degree or certificate students placed in developmental writing or reading courses should register for them during their first semester. These courses help students gain competencies necessary to succeed in college-level courses.

- WRTG 111X-plus pairs a section of WRTG F111X with WRTG F068. Qualifying students are those who have a combined ACCUPLACER Classic score between 130-169 or an ACCUPLACER Next Generation score between 490-529 and are referred by their academic advisor to Jennifer Tilbury <jtilbury@alaska.edu> at UAF Community & Technical College or the appropriate WRTG F111X-plus instructor of record to interview for the program. WRTG F068 is a writing support group tutorial class, recommended based on the student's needs for writing assistance along with any WRTG course listed in the table. Students may take up to three credits of WRTG F068 per semester for as many semesters as needed.
- If a student's standardized test scores are below the minimum in the table but their high school cumulative GPA is 3.0 or higher, the student may be given permission to enroll in WRTG F111X by the Director of University Writing or the Director of Student Success & Instruction at UAF CTC, or rural campus writing faculty.
- WRTG F111X placement is required for all Natural Science GER courses, unless otherwise indicated in the catalog.
- Students with ACT or SAT scores that place them in WRTG F211X, WRTG F213X or WRTG F214X may receive local advanced placement credit for WRTG F111X upon completion of WRTG F211X, WRTG F212X, WRTG F213X or WRTG F214X with a grade of C or better. To receive this credit, students should submit the Application for WRTG F111X Credit form to the Office of the Registrar.
- Accuplacer Classic will no longer be administered after January 2019. It is being replaced by Accuplacer Next Generation effective fall 2018.
- Accuplacer Next Generation placement is based on the lowest of the two separate Writing and Reading Scores.

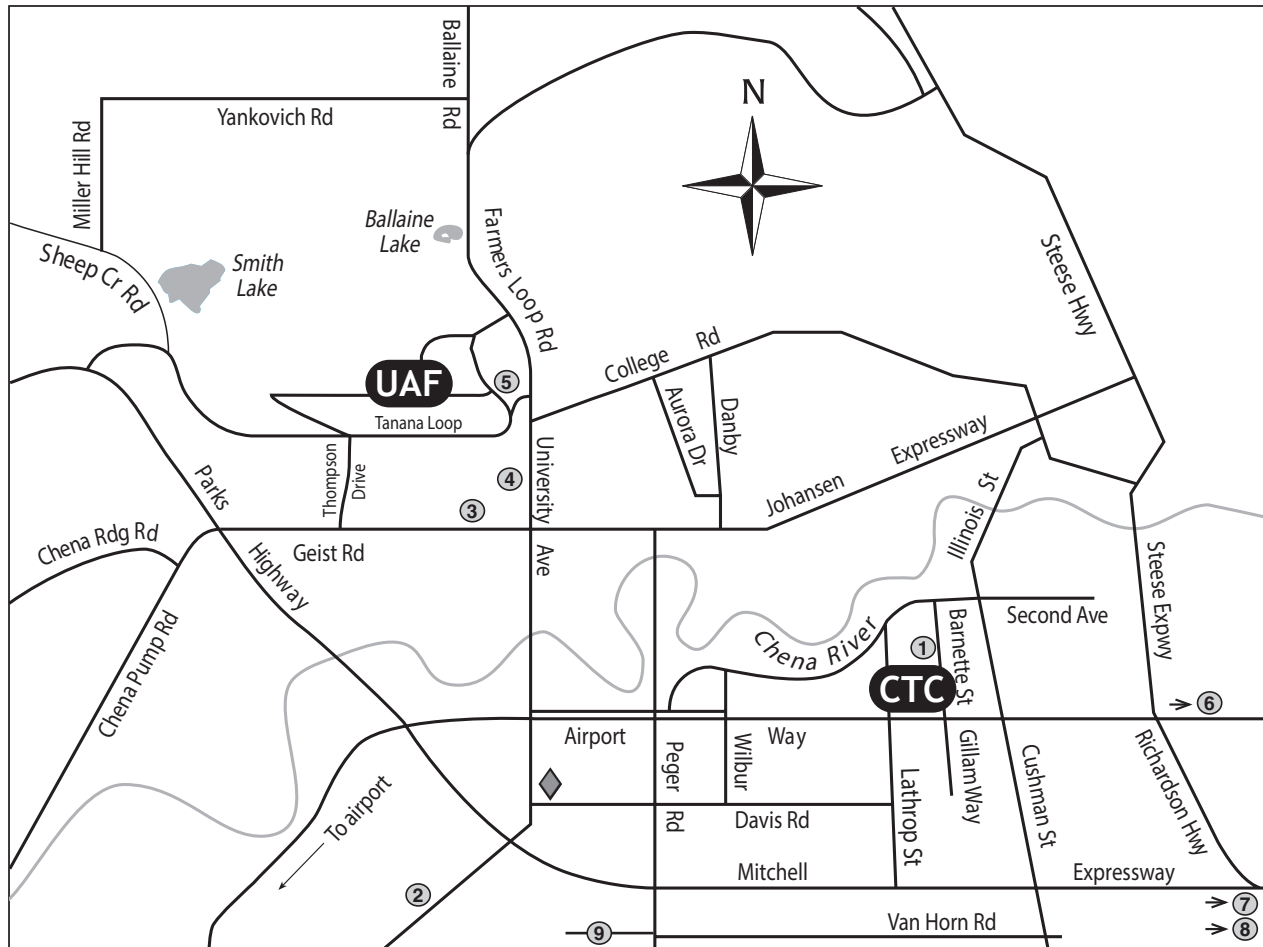
