

Health & Safety Plan August/September 2023 Review

The health and safety of the students, staff, and families of the Twin Valley School District (TVSD) remains, as always, a priority for the District.

The TVSD has identified District standards and expectations, which outline the protocols expected of all staff members as the District transitions forward. Protocols include the following:

- Self-screening for symptoms
- Following communicable disease reporting procedures
- Practicing hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette
- Use of face coverings is optional
- Maintain a clean school environment
- Staying informed and maintaining best practices

TVSD returned to full in-person instruction in the Fall of 2020. Along with inperson instruction, the TVSD continued to offer their own Twin Valley Virtual Academy (TVVA) for families wishing to opt for this type of instructional model.

Additionally, hand sanitizer will be provided in common areas. Avoid touching one's eyes, nose, and mouth. Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, or cough or sneeze into one's elbow. Reminders to staff and students will be provided with respect to encouraging those who are sick or have illness to stay home and where appropriate, always follow primary care physician recommendations.
d. Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation.	 The District started and is in the process of completing a comprehensive HVAC Project, which upgrades all ventilation in buildings to a four-pipe, dedicated outside air system (DOAS) for improved comfort, air flow, and efficiency.
e. Contact tracing in combination with isolation and guarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments.	 DOH's listing of reportable diseases will be followed per TVSD Policy #203.

Accommodations may include, but are not limited to, adapted service delivery models when appropriate and/or other health and safety precautions as outlined in an individualized health plan.
