
Due to the nature of our school and the small class sizes, QSI International School of Belize does not rank students. The cumulative GPA on the student's transcript only reflects courses taken at QSI. Grades from previous schools are not included in the GPA but they are listed on student transcripts.

SAT Scores

The SAT was administered to 18 students from 2016-2022. The student population is too small to share the mean score.

Advance Placement Program

QSI International School of Belize offers online AP courses as needed. We do not have a set limit on the number of AP classes that students can take. Secondary students may earn AP Capstone through QVS online.











Grading

Mastery of each essential unit is evaluated with an A or B (Mastery grades). A designation of "B" denotes mastery of learning outcomes at a high level of understanding. A designation of "A" denotes mastery where the student demonstrates higher order thinking skills. Mediocre or poor work, resulting in a "D:" deficient in effort, is not acceptable, and students will re-engage until they demonstrate mastery. Students who master a unit with a "B" evaluation may attempt to demonstrate a higher level of mastery, within that current school year, to change the evaluation to an "A" Assessment is continuous and student performance is assessed on learning outcomes and units of study.

Credits/Units

Year-long courses are divided into 10 units, with 10 units equal to one Carnegie Unit; students receive credit only for units mastered at a B or A level. Secondary transcripts show the number of units completed for each course per school year and the average grade for the units completed in each course.

Graduation Requirements

The school offers three diplomas.

Academic Diploma with Honors: 24 Carnegie Units (240 QSI Unit Credits)

Requirements are the same as The Academic Diploma with the added condition that accumulated credits include at least two IB certificates or Advanced Placement (AP) courses. A total of 240 credits are required for this diploma.
