

Transporting Musical Instruments on School Buses – Large/Heavy

It is important that we consider the safety of the students in the event of an emergency when transporting many kinds of musical instruments to and from school on buses. Buses are designed to transport students not cargo. Priority for seating will be for students if buses are full.

All musical instruments transported in the passenger area on a school bus must be positioned in such a way that they do not block or obstruct in any way the aisle, stairwell, or emergency window exits.

Extremely large and bulky instruments shall not be carried on the bus at any time. These include Tubas, Large Drums, String Bases, Baritone Horns, Baritone Saxes, Cellos, Guitars, and Bass Guitars.

Transporting Musical Instruments on School Buses - Moderate

Pending seat availability, moderately large and bulky instruments shall be positioned in the seat with the student.

The instruments shall be positioned in the seat next to the window and if possible, rest on the floor and in between the seat bottom and seat back. To avoid problems, this should be done in the first three or four seats from the front.

These include French Horn, Violins/ Violas, Tenor Saxes, Trombones, Bass Clarinets and Drums.

Transporting Musical Instruments on School Buses - Small

Pending seat capacity, small Instruments may be carried in the seat with the student.

These include Flute, Oboes, Clarinets, Alto Saxes and Trumpets.



Please note the following:

- Any instrument placed on the floor must be against the outside (window) wall, as no student should have to climb over an instrument to exit in an emergency.
- Leg spacing on buses ranges from 7-10 inches. Instruments must fit on the student's lap or within the leg space of each seat.
- Instruments may not exceed the height of the bottom of the window ledge, which ranges from 29 to 32 inches.
- No instrument shall be transported behind the last rear seats per state law.
- The emergency exits cannot be blocked.
- Careful attention to these procedures will ensure safe transportation for the students and their musical instruments.

Students are cautioned that failure to abide by these procedures may cause the forfeiture of the privileges to transport their musical instruments on a school bus. Please use consideration to the weight and size of the instrument and the size of the child. Any instrument too heavy or large for the student to lift and carry up the steps by themselves should be avoided.

Drivers have the responsibility and right to refuse any instrument or object on the bus that they see as a safety hazard.
