



Roseville Area Middle School Parent and Family Engagement Plan

School Year: 2023-2024

Roseville Area Middle School is committed to the goal of providing quality education for every child in this district. We want to establish partnerships with parents and with the community. Everyone gains if school and homework together to support high achievement of our children. We can't do this job alone. Parents and families play an extremely important role as children's first teachers. Their support for their children and for the school is critical to their children's success at every step along the way.

Part I. Description of how the District and School will Implement Required Components

1. Roseville Area Middle School will engage parents and families who have Title I students in developing/revising the district and school policy.
 - School Year plan sharing/Open House – (August, RAMS)
 - School Year Plan sharing/Fall Family Connection Night at RAMS – (September, RAMS)
 - Plan sharing and update with parents at conferences Fall (October), Winter (December) and Spring (March)
 - Family Fun/Trivia Night/Registration for RAHS (January, RAMS)
 - Plan update -Career Night AVID/Academy/DLI/EL at RAMS - (April, RAMS)
 - Update and future planning - Spring Family Night at RAMS - (May, RAMS)

2. Roseville Area Middle School will convene an annual meeting, at a convenient time, when the parents and family members of participating children are available to attend. The Title I annual meeting will inform parents/families about the Title I program, explain the requirements of parent and family engagement and the rights and responsibilities of the parents to be involved.

We will have copies of the RAMS Title 1 Plans available at RAMS Open House in August, in addition to answering in person questions regarding the program. An annual meeting to gather additional insights, ideas and feedback from parents will be held in September as part of a larger schoolwide Family Connection Night at Roseville Area Middle School. The Academy teacher will also inform parents during fall conferences (November) at RAMS. Interpreters are available

onsite for parents needing that support in Spanish, Karen, Hmong, Somali and Nepali. If a parent needs another language we will make arrangements prior to the conference. Transportation to Family Nights and conferences will also be provided to families as needed.

3. Roseville Area Middle School will offer flexible meeting times during morning, during the school day, evening or weekends and may provide transportation, childcare or home visits.

RAMS will offer families flexible meeting times in the morning, evening or during school as needed to support students and families. Transportation, childcare or home visits may be provided as needed. Information will be shared during our fall Open House, Title I Family Nights, Conference nights, via e-mail, Talking Points, and phone calls home. We will also provide families the opportunities to conference with us via Zoom if they are interested. We have found this new method highly effective to communicate with parents.

4. Roseville Area Middle School will involve parents/families in the planning and review of the school improvement plan and the joint development of the schoolwide plan when applicable. If the schoolwide plan is not satisfactory to the parents, submit comments on the plan when submitted to the district. [Section 1114(b)]

RAMS will meet this requirement through our site improvement plan and by gathering input regarding the Parent and Family Engagement (PFE) plan during our Open House in August and from our Fall Family Connection Night in September. Parents are surveyed at evening events (Family nights and PTA meetings) for feedback and to update our plans if needed. The information gathered is included in the SIP.

5. Roseville Area Middle School will provide assistance to parents/families of Title students:
 - a. Timely information about programs offered to engage in their child's education.
 - b. An explanation of the curriculum, state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments, and the achievement levels of the state academic standards.
 - c. If parents/families request, opportunities for regular meetings to hear their suggestions and participate in decisions related to their child's education.
 - d. List (see table below) parent and family engagement activities that will support families in helping their children meet academic standards. Examples of such activities are conferences, workshops, Tech night, curriculum night/event, math and reading night/events.

End of Year Celebration	May 2024	<p>We will review successes and areas of growth from this year and elicit feedback into how we can improve the program.</p> <p>We will share book recommendations from the Ramsey County library. We will provide students/families with a high interest and appropriately leveled book and have them write down other books from the book recommendations to check out during the summer. We will provide families with a book to begin a Family Book Club. We will follow-up with a family book review. We will also share tested math games and strategies for families to learn and play together. We will provide families with a list of games, provide each family with one game and QR codes that link to how to play the various games.</p>

Family Nights	September 2023, January 2024 March 2024	<p>Title 1 Family Nights are used to teach parents and students together what's needed to be a successful reading and math student. Each night will have a focus and activity where families will engage in a learning opportunity that they can use at home with their children.</p> <p>We will host a Family engagement night focused on building each family's ability to support their student at home with mathematics. We will host a Math Escape Room at RAMS where families can learn to use the MCA calculator and get one to use at home with their students. This will help parents support their student with their math understanding.</p> <p>We will host a family night inviting a speaker to talk about stress and its impacts on home and academic life. We will discuss strategies and methods to help limit the impact of stress and provide families with items to take home to help with stress relief</p> <p>We will host a family night inviting a speaker to join us and discuss how parent engagement increases student achievement while giving practical and easy to use tips for parents.</p>
Career Night	April 2024	Academy students will join AVID, DLI and EL families in visiting with and learning about a wide variety of careers available.

Part II. Description of the Shared Responsibilities for High Student Academic Achievement
