CTE American Sign Language 3

- PS 1 Interpersonal signing: Maintain and sustain conversation about a broad level of topics at the Intermediate-low level.
- PS 2 Interpersonal signing: Ask and answer a variety of questions that require follow-up questions and responses at the Intermediate-low level in ASL.
- PS 3 Presentational expressive signing: Deliver a short signed presentation on a topic at the Intermediate-low level in ASL.
- PS 4 Presentational expressive signing: Students present information that contains a variety of vocabulary, phrases, and patterns at the Intermediate-low level in ASL.
- PS 5 Interpretive signing: Understand signed language that incorporates familiar vocabulary and structures at Intermediate-low level signing.
- PS 6 Interpretive signing: Comprehend simple ASL conversational techniques on familiar topics and selected, age-appropriate (Intermediate-low level) authentic recordings, broadcasts and videos.
- PS 7 Cultural practices: use appropriate visual and non visual behaviors for daily activities among Deaf peers and adults in the community.
- PS 8 Cultural perspectives: Identify common beliefs, social etiquette and attitudes within the Deaf culture that compares/contrasts with the hearing norms.
- PS 9 Connections across disciplines: Identify some major contributions and historical figures from the cultures studied that are significant in the target culture.
- PS 10 Connections across disciplines; Investigate careers where ASL skills can be directly and indirectly applied.
- PS 11 Language Comparisons: Identify cultural characteristics of language such as Deaf cultural norms that compare to hearing norms (such as visual-learning, non-spoken instructional opportunity).
- PS 12 Communities: Participate in an activity to experience ASL beyond the school setting and identify cultural characteristics and traits as related to the community.
