Morton West High School is one of two high schools in District 201. It serves the communities of Berwyn, Stickney, Forest View and a portion of Lyons. The school is located just two miles west of the Chicago city limits. Morton's students have the benefit of being part of a diverse student body, which has a 90% minority population. While the largest minority group is Hispanic, many diverse cultures are represented in the student body. Thus, our students have the opportunity to develop appreciation for the diversity that exists in our society. Morton West has approximately 3,500 students with the average class size being 23-1.
