ISL Qatar's Milestones and Direction

Dear ISL Qatar Community,

I am delighted to share the remarkable achievements and progress that ISL Qatar made during the 2022-23 academic year. In addition to obtaining continued accreditation status with NEASC (New England Association of Schools and Colleges) and the IB (International Baccalaureate), we embarked on an exciting journey that resulted in the development of a new mission, vision, and core values. This has laid the foundation for a more transformative and unified direction for our community.

Last October, we formed a mission working group comprised of 10 stakeholders representing the board, leadership, educational and non-educational support staff, students, and parents. In early November, we convened to plan a survey that was subsequently sent to parents, staff, and secondary students in mid-November. The survey results demonstrated that the community supported the current guiding statements but lacked awareness of them unless specifically pointed out. This lack of awareness was attributed to the lengthy and verbose nature of the statements, as well as the lack of regular communication and reinforcement.

To address this issue, our strategic planning consultant, John Roberts, visited the school in early January and conducted several focus groups with various stakeholders, including leadership, educational staff, noneducational staff, parents, primary students, and secondary students. These sessions involved discussions and documentation of their perceptions of the school's current values and distinguishing characteristics, as well as their aspirations for our school and students. Word clouds containing keywords and concepts were shared from these sessions through follow-up surveys. The community validated these top words and concepts and had the opportunity to share additional suggestions.







In late January, the mission working group met to analyze the data collected from the stakeholder groups and surveys, curated by John Roberts. The group began drafting new values, mission, and vision statements based on this analysis. In February, the mission working group shared working drafts of the new guiding statements with the community and sought further feedback through surveys. Subsequently, representatives from the mission working group, the school leadership team, and the board convened a retreat to finalize the guiding statements and initiate the creation of a strategic plan with

specific goals and objectives.


Our new **mission** is, "*Empowering learners* to lead through compassion, collaboration, creativity, and critical thinking." We are dedicated to nurturing students who attain their full potential and possess the skills and mindset to make a positive impact on the world. Our new **vision** is, "*Imagining and designing a better world together.*" We aim to inspire our learning community to work towards a fair and sustainable future.

The guiding principles that will shape our actions are the values of **Belonging**, **Integrity**, **Grit**, and **Kindness**. Belonging emphasizes the sense of being part of a











community where everyone is respected and valued. Integrity guides our actions and decision-making, encouraging honesty, transparency, and a commitment to doing what is right. Grit embodies perseverance, dedication, and determination in the face of challenges. While kindness underpins all aspects of life, emphasizing empathy, understanding, and compassion in our interactions with one another.

During March and early May, strategic goalfocus area teams met to create their goals, objectives, and a three-year action plan. A virtual retreat in late May culminated the process, ensuring the finalization of the plan. The team presented their proposed language for each intention, allowing for comment and critique from the larger strategic plan team. Each smart action goal and objective was also reviewed for further input to ensure agreement. The strategic plan was cross-checked with the recent NEASC/IB accreditation report, and audit reports on technology and experience strategy were also incorporated into the plan.

To ensure the long-term success of ISL Qatar, we have developed a strategic plan with four focus areas. These include:

- 1. Enhancing inclusive, personalized, and equitable learning.
- 2. Building meaningful relationships within our community.
- 3. Optimizing the use of learning spaces and resources.
- 4. Ensuring effective governance, financial planning, and leadership.

By aligning our actions with these strategic focus areas, we aim to provide the best possible education for our learners, equipping them with the necessary skills, knowledge, and values to thrive in a dynamic world.

Before closing out the 2022-23 school year, we communicated and celebrated the new mission, vision, values, and strategic plan with the ISL Qatar staff and students.

Furthermore, we will launch the 2023-24 school year with our new strategic plan. We will engage the community in unpacking the mission, vision, values, and strategic plan, linking annual goals for leaders and staff with the actionable objectives of the plan. We will provide the community with ongoing progress updates.



Class of 2023 Results

We are thrilled to highlight the accomplishments of the graduating Class of 2023. 57 graduates (100%) completed the ISL Qatar High School diploma successfully. Different from many schools offering the IB (INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE) diploma, ISL Qatar is an inclusive school offering providing multiple pathways such as the full IB diploma and/or the High School Diploma, ISL Qatar offers an equal opportunity to all students to access the IB programme either as a full diploma or a course student.

This year all our 57 high school graduates enrolled in at least some of the IB course examinations. As a cohort, in total, the graduates received 342 IB certificates for the various courses they studied during the May 2023 examination cycle. 4% of our full IB diploma candidates took the exams with accommodations. 44 dedicated students earned the prestigious IB diploma, symbolizing their commitment to academic excellence and personal growth.

As a multilingual school we offer support for diverse languages. Among our remarkable achievers, 13 students have earned Bilingual Diplomas in 7 different languages. This is a commendable accomplishment that showcases their language proficiency and global outlook. Overall, our bilingual diplomas constitute an impressive 30% of the total diplomas awarded, highlighting the diverse skills within our student body.

Elevating our pride even further, we are excited to announce that the highest score achieved by a student is an impressive 41. This remarkable achievement underlines the dedication and diligence that our students consistently exhibit. Furthermore, an impressive 16% of our students

have attained scores of at least 36, truly demonstrating their drive for exceptional academic performance. Equally commendable, 32% and 55% of our students have secured scores of 33 or more, and 30 or more, respectively, reflecting the depth and breadth of their knowledge and skills. Adding to our impressive results, the 2023 ISL Qatar Average Subject Score of 5 illustrates our students' consistent excellence across diverse subjects. A full 100% of our students have passed the Extended Essay and Theory of Knowledge component, a reflection of their critical thinking and research skills. Moreover, our students' dedication has contributed to an 83.33% pass rate of our full IB Diploma candidates, surpassing the 2023 World Average Pass Rate of 79.67%.

It is important to note that our students' achievements extend beyond the classroom. Notably, every one of our students has completed the Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) requirements, exemplifying their well-rounded engagement in academic pursuits and extracurricular activities.

Lastly, all our students have started the journey for university except those who have chosen to take a gap year, enroll for military service, language enrichment course or apply late for southern hemisphere universities. As we celebrate our students' exceptional journey through ISL Qatar High School, we acknowledge not only their individual triumphs but also the collaborative efforts of our devoted educators and the unwavering support of the ISL Qatar community. Congratulations to the Class of 2023! Your achievements are a source of immense pride and inspiration for us all.



Netball

Second to football, netball is one of the premier girls' school sports in Qatar. In the last two academic years, ISL Qatar lost several of its developing and experienced players which resulted in needing to once again increase the growth of the game. Adding to that the effect of the unfavorable PHE changes made in the MYP curriculum, the participation rate in 2022 - 2023 was the lowest it has been since 2017.

To widen the interest in the sport, a selected group of grade 4 and 5 girls attended the QPPSSA Netball Festival where the main aim is to inquire, learn and explore the game in a friendly competition against other schools.

A similar program was implemented with the U14 and U16 girls developing teams.

In terms of competitive success, the U19 Girls Netball team showed a high level of fitness, tenacity and drive to overcome Sherborne Girls in two over-time periods to finish the QUESS netball competition in 3rd place. An outstanding finish when one looks at the training facilities and staffing of ISL Qatar's competitors. Finishing behind both Doha College teams is truly a remarkable achievement.

Swimming

In its inaugural year, swimming became a part of the students' curriculum. Leaning on the expertise of the dedicated swimming teachers, Ms Fatma and Ms Ana, for the first time in its existence, ISL Qatar formed its (primary) swim team.

Entering a very small team in grade 3 to 5, ISL Qatar students produced results that should make any avid sports person get excited about what's to come in 2023 - 2024.

One notable initiative is the establishment of a Research Institute, where we collaborate with leading and renowned experts and institutions. Through exciting and developmentally appropriate methods, we teach our middle and high school students research methodologies typically reserved for university graduate students. This unique opportunity allows our students to develop advanced research skills at an early stage, preparing them for future academic pursuits.

The school also provides various platforms to showcase students' innovative projects and solutions. Through partnerships with local businesses and organizations, we offer opportunities for students to apply their skills in practical ways. For instance, some of our students have programmed



and designed original, old-fashioned arcade games for sale in a local gaming store. Additionally, other groups of students have recently participated and emerged as winners in STEM engineering contests. For instance, this year, the Tech Hub has incorporated Minecraft for Education, leveraging this popular platform to facilitate collaborative and immersive learning in various subjects. Our E-Sports initiatives have enabled students to explore the world of competitive gaming while developing teamwork, strategic thinking, and digital literacy skills.

ISL Qatar further amplifies its pursuit of innovation through its 'Week Without Walls' programme. This initiative provides students with an opportunity to venture beyond the confines of the classroom and to explore and learn. By participating in this programme, students are invited to embark on a journey that immerses them in diverse cultures and experiences, fostering within the individual a heightened sense of global awareness and understanding.
