



## School Health Advisory Council Special Meeting Minutes

Meeting start time – 6:03 p.m.

### **Opening Statements:**

- Meeting called to order by Teresa; Amanda, Chair unable to attend.
- Round Table Introductions were performed:
  - Committee members introduced themselves as well as KISD staff.
- Prior minutes from June 7<sup>th</sup> and June 9<sup>th</sup> were approved at 6:09 p.m.
  - Meeting minutes were previously sent out to SHAC members via email for review.

### **Review of SHAC Requirements as well as Legislation Changes by Dr. Vu:**

- SHAC requirements regarding mandatory prevention programming were reviewed as well as SHAC goal were discussed:
  - SHAC's goal for this meeting is to approve a motion to recommend curriculum material to the Board that aligns with the new Health TEKS and updated legislation.
- Relevant legislation passed within the last 15 months reviewed:
  - Senate Bill 9: Requires schools to provide education on prevention related to child abuse, family violence, dating violence, and human trafficking. The focus is on a prevention program and identification/recognition of potential indicators of the above subjects.
    - The curriculum is presented in middle school and high school.
    - Curriculum material must be based on SHAC values and suitable for the grade level and reviewed by academic experts.
  - HB 1525: Requires SHAC recommendations on health curriculum and Board approval, along with parental consent prior to any instruction provided to students.
    - Parents MUST opt-in their child before any instruction is provided.
    - Parental consent must be received no later than the 14<sup>th</sup> day before instruction.

### **Synopsis of Curriculum Programs Provided:**

- District considerations when reviewing curriculum resources were discussed:
  - Cost-effective for the district
  - Availability Access: The district would like a curriculum that can easily be accessed by parents prior to instruction time (online access)
  - The curriculum should be grade-level appropriate
- Review of current curriculum programs provided by Dr. Vu:
  - Play It Safe: Meets current State and Federal guidelines for the required curriculum.
    - TEK-based curriculum that utilizes videos and scripted discussion materials that are grade-level appropriate.
    - Instruction is provided on a class-by-class basis by trained employees.



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- Second Step Curriculum:
  - Current guidance programs used by counselors in the classrooms to provide education and resources to support mental health and wellness.
- Human and Growth Development Class:
  - Age-appropriate information about personal health and hygiene habits along with the teaching of anatomy of the human body and changes that come with puberty.
- Review of Proposed Curriculum Programs:
  - CATCH: Updated instructional resources for physical education.
  - Aim for Success:
    - Judi Kinney – Aim for Success Representative, provided a quick overview of the program.
      - Committee members were provided with a preview video via email.
      - The program is SRA based. (Sexual Risk Avoidance)
      - The program is geared for 6<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade.
      - Meets current State and Federal guidelines for the required curriculum.
      - Provides parental access to the program around two weeks prior to student instruction.

### **Closing Remarks/Q&A:**

- Q/A of curriculum programs provided
- Board recommendations discussed:
  - SHAC decided that they would move forward with the proposed curriculum programs.
    - Motion failed to only approve the Aim for Success presentation for 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade failed.
    - Motion approved for the Aim for Success presentation to be provided in 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup> grade.
      - 7 votes of approval provided
      - 1 abstained vote
- Dr. Vu will move forward with presenting the above recommendations to the Board during their next meeting.
