FLAG FOOTBALL

The Livingston High varsity flag football team rebounded from last Tuesday's overtime defeat vs Merced with victory over Buhach Colony on Thursday (9/21.) The Pack was back in action Tuesday (9/26) in a game vs Atwater that could put them back in a tie for first



place at the end of the first round of CCC play. The Wolves got off to a fast start scoring a touchdown in the opening 2 minutes of the contest. Atwater settled in and scored 20 unanswered points to take a 20-6 lead with 8 minutes left in the 1st half. The Pack would find their flow on offense and tie the game at 20-20 in the final minute of the 1st half. In the 2nd half, the Wolves scored twice while the defense held the visiting Falcons scoreless. Final score: LHS 32, Falcons 20. Offensively, the Wolves had five different players score: Tatianna Alvarez, 4 catches for 107 yards and 1 TD, Kasandra Soria, 2 catches, 11 yards, 1 TD, Olivia Costa, 1 catch, 35 yards, 1 TD, Alyana Palafox, 2 catches, 39 yards and 1 TD, and quarterback Elizabeth Avila ended the night going 16 of 27, for 277 yards and 4 TDs. Avila also had 5 rushes for 57 yards and rushing TD. Defensively, Adriana Cervantes and Frankie Solis lead the team in flag pulls with 5 each. The defense also caused four interceptions. The Wolves finish the first round of league play tied at the top of the standings at 6-1 with Atwater and Merced. The Wolves begin the second round of league play against Golden Valley on Thursday at home; JV at 6:00 pm, varsity at 7:00 pm.
