

Students should choose at least one activity from each area (Math, Reading, Writing/Word Study, and Science/Social Studies to be completed on an inclement weather e-learning day. Also check with your specials teachers.

Practice multiplication and division facts for 15 minutes. This may be done online, with a deck of cards, or with flashcards. Express remainders as fractions.	Read from your independent book for 20 minutes and write a summary of what you read. You may also read a book on EPIC!	Write a letter to your 4th grade teacher telling them about how 5th grade is going so far. Use as many details as possible.	Create a map showing the route you take to get from your home to school. Don't forget a title, key, compass rose, and labels.
Complete 10 traditional multiplication problems (multi-digit by multi-digit). These can be done on IXL, AAAMath, or by using a deck of cards.	Read aloud to someone at home for 20 minutes.	Write a personal narrative about why you are at home today and what you wish you could be doing instead.	Summarize (1-2 paragraphs) a major current event taking place in the world. Use the newspaper, magazines, or online sources (CNN10) as a source for information.
Compute 5 fraction addition problems and 5 fraction subtraction problems with common AND uncommon denominators. These can be done on IXL, AAAMath.com, or by using a deck of cards (draw four cards, placing 2 cards as numerators and 2 cards as denominators).	Read an informational text article from a magazine, newspaper, or reference material and use your inferring skills to determine the main idea. List 3 supporting statements to justify your thinking.	Write a letter of advice about 5th grade to a 4th grader. What should they know? What should they prepare themselves for?	Place some ice cubes into a bowl and set it on the counter. Record how long it takes to melt and other observations you have. Explain why the ice melted.
Level up in Prodigy for 30 minutes or go to IXL and choose 3 5th grade skills to practice for 10 minutes each.	Choose a book in your home. Find 5 words in the book you do not know the meaning of and look them up. Use context clues and other resources to help you define the words.	Create a spelling game with your word sort and play it with someone at home. Or, go online to Google Classroom to access our spelling games and play for 20 minutes.	Choose a historical figure to research and write a short biography on. The biography should be at least 2 paragraphs.
Round decimals to the nearest hundredth, tenth, and whole number. This can be done on IXL, AAAMath.com, or by using a deck of cards to draw 4 numbers and inserting a decimal point into the number.	Read an article in a newspaper, magazine, or online source. Identify the main idea and cite 2 pieces of evidence to support the idea.	Write a story using the following elements: Characters: Miss Seibold and a monkey Setting: Rainforest Problem: Lost and alone (with the monkey) with an umbrella, a magnifying glass, and an orange	Design a science experiment with approval and assistance of someone at home. What scientific question are you trying to answer? How are you going to conduct the experiment? What are the results of your experiment (desired and actual)?
