GRADE CONVERSION CHART

Beginning with the 2022/2023 school year, Duchesne adopted a new grading scale. Cumulative GPA is calculated and reported using a 4.0 scale, instead of the former 100-point scale. All honors courses receive an added 0.5 GPA point; all AP courses receive an added 1.0 GPA point which is averaged into the cumulative GPA. Course grades reported on the transcript are not weighted. Duchesne does not report student rank.


