## **AP Scholars**

Each year, many of our students take Advanced Placement (AP) exams in 14 subject areas. Advanced Placement is a program in the United States, as well as internationally, created by the College Board, which offers college-level curricula and examinations to high school students. Colleges and universities may grant course credit to students who obtain high scores on the AP exams. College Board defines AP exam scores in terms of how capable the student is of receiving credit for a college course. The scores range on a scale from 1 (lowest) to 5 (highest). We are pleased to announce our students had a passing rate of 86%, far exceeding the state and global passing rates. In addition, a total of 48 current and recent BCS graduates have earned 2023 AP Scholars Awards in recognition of their exceptional achievement on AP exams.

AP Scholar is granted to students who earned a 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams. 












# **Cubby Buddies**

#### **Blood Drive**


BCS hosts a blood drive three times a year:




