If you have a child in kindergarten through grade three who has trouble reading, help is on the way.

Ohio's Third Grade Reading Guarantee directs schools to identify students in kindergarten through grade three who are having trouble reading, and provide them with extra reading help. The goal is to get those boys and girls caught up in reading as soon as possible.

If you have a son or daughter who still struggles with reading at the end of grade three, we will talk with you about *placing* your child in fourth grade and continuing with third grade reading. This may be for all, or only part of the school year.
