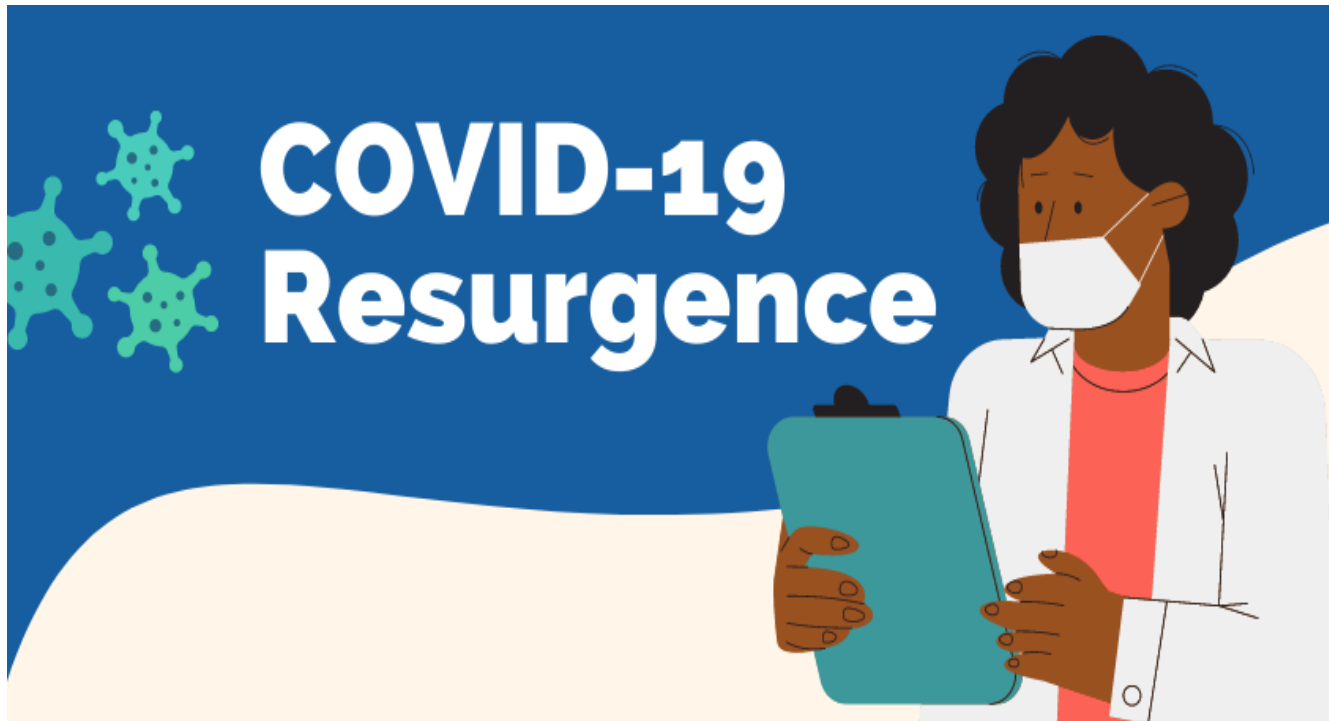
Covid-19 Resurgence

A new, extremely contagious COVID-19 variant (BA.2.86) has been detected in multiple countries around the globe, including the United States. The BA.2.86 is an Omicron subvariant, which is being tracked by both the World Health Organization (WHO) and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). This new rise in illness has caused some businesses and schools to reinstate mask mandates to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The latest data, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), shows hospitalizations due to COVID-19 are up 15.7% in the past week, and deaths up 10.5%. Dr. David Dowdy, an infectious disease epidemiologist at Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, suggests that the current surge in cases may be due to immunity from vaccination.

Despite this variant being highly contagious, it is thought that it won't ravage the country like the original pandemic. Former White House chief medical advisor Dr. Anthony Fauci stated, "Given the level of immunity that we all have...people who have been vaccinated, boosted, people who have been infected like you and I, where we have hybrid immunity, the chances of this being an overwhelming rush of cases and hospitalizations is probably low."

It is believed that COVID-19 will become seasonal. "COVID Season" is projected to align with Flu season, predominantly in the fall and winter. Experts recommend extensive personal hygiene and masks, especially during fall and winter, to stay healthy.



The Aftermath of Idalia

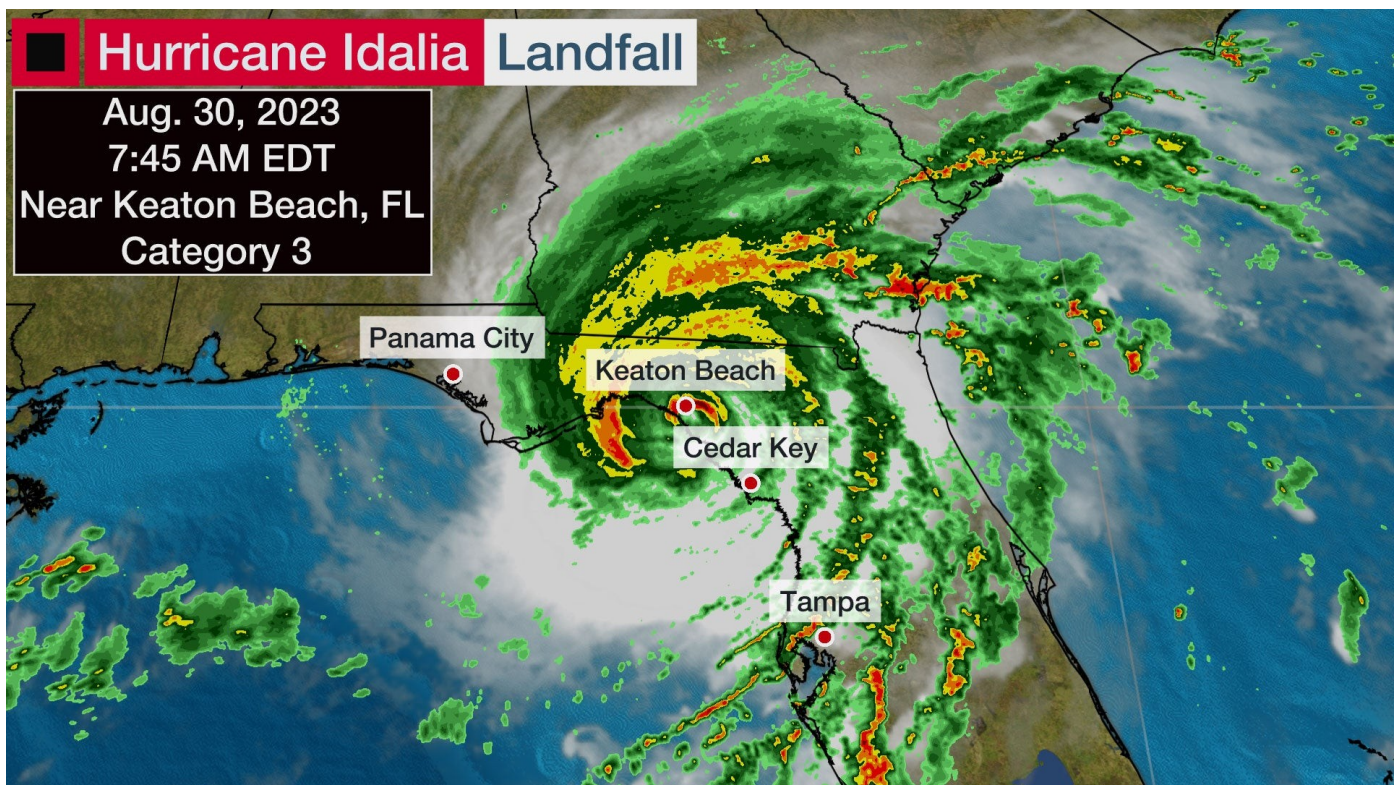

On August 30th, 2023, Hurricane Idalia made landfall on the coast of Florida. The category three hurricane ravaged and destroyed homes, towns, businesses, and other buildings in the surrounding area. Winds reached speeds up to 125 miles per hour and resulted in severe flooding of up to eight feet in the affected areas.

It is estimated that Idalia caused around 12 to 20 billion dollars in damages. There have been three confirmed deaths, and the storm has displaced around 10,000 people. The hurricane has also left nearly half a million people without power these past few days and maybe more to come.

The last storm closest to Idalia's strength to hit the region was another category-three hurricane in 1896. Idalia's storm surges were record-breaking from Tampa to the Big Bend. More than eight feet of storm surges brought Cedar Key to 6.8 feet above its highest normal tides on Wednesday evening. Clearwater Beach also set a record high with 4.05 feet.

With homes and businesses destroyed, the next step is rebuilding. Governor Ron DeSantis has been earning praise from Florida citizens for the amazing leadership and actions he has taken to help the state recover from Idalia. Surely with a great leader like him, things will get up and running in no time.



Former President in Legal Trouble

Your Republican nominee, Donald Trump, is currently being investigated in Georgia for his efforts to overturn the 2020 election. This marks the fourth criminal case brought against former president, Donald Trump.

In this case, he is being investigated by the Fulton County District Attorney, Fani Willis. There are currently 41 charges brought against the 19 defendants, including Trump for seeking to overturn Joe Biden's win in Georgia. The other 18 defendants include former White House Chief of Staff, former lawyers, and fake electors. Fake electors are a group of 16 people who secretly met in Georgia's capital and signed faux certificates that would be sent to the National Archives. Fulton County District Attorney Fani Willis has set a deadline on August 25th for the 19 defendants to turn themselves in.

This began when former President Donald Trump lost to the current President Joe Biden in the 2020 presidential election. This would lead Trump and his allies to make a push to overturn the results in Georgia. On January 2nd, 2021, Trump called Georgia's top election official, Brad Raffensberger. The former President would call Brad Raffensberger and ask for 11,780 votes to be overturned. Raffensberger would decline Trump's attempt to overturn Georgia.

In January 2022, Fani Willis asked Fulton County to approve a special counsel grand jury to assist her in the investigation of the former president. A special purpose grand jury was brought in to see if organized crime is occurring in the place that it sits in. The regular grand jury ended up voting to file charges against the former president.

Even with all these charges brought against Donald Trump, he is still able to run for president. However, different civil lawsuits could bar the former president from holding office.



A New Texas Law

On September 1st, 2023, a law in Texas was passed stating that child support will be paid by the offender if a child loses a parent or guardian due to intoxicated manslaughter. The law states that child support will be paid until the child is 18 years old, or until the child graduates from high school.

Greg Abbot, the current governor of Texas, posted on X, “Any time a parent passes is tragic, but a death at the hands of a drunk driver is especially heinous. I was proud to sign HB 393 into law this year to require offenders to pay child support for the children of their victims.”

The amount paid will be decided by a court based on a multitude of influencing factors. Such factors include the individual financial needs of the child and current guardian or caretaker. Furthermore, if the defendant can not make the payments due to being incarcerated, they can wait until no later than the first anniversary of their release. This act only applies to an offense committed on or after September 1st.



Elon Musk Against Anti-Semitism Claims

Elon Musk, the renowned tech mogul, has recently faced allegations of anti-Semitism. Following his ownership of X, Musk has been accused of allowing for the exemplification of anti-Semitic posts. In response to these allegations, Musk posted, "To be super clear, I'm pro free speech, but against anti-Semitism of any kind."

Such allegations came to light following a post made by the Anti-Defamation League (ADL). As stated on their X profile, their mission statement is "[to] stop the defamation of the Jewish people, and secure justice and fair treatment to all #FightingHateForGood."

Musk reported that the anti-Semitism claims have reduced the revenue of X by approximately four billion dollars. He revealed on X, "Our US advertising revenue is still down 60% primarily due to pressure on advertisers by @ADL (that's what advertisers tell us), so they almost succeeded in killing X/Twitter!"

Jonathan Greenblatt, the CEO of the Anti-Defamation League, noted, "It is profoundly disturbing that Elon Musk spent the weekend engaging with a highly toxic, antisemitic campaign on his platform... Finally, we saw the campaign manifest in the real world when masked men marched in Florida on Saturday brazenly waving flags adorned with swastikas and chanting 'Ban the ADL.'"

This defamation and mass loss in revenue prompted Musk to threaten the Anti-Defamation League with a lawsuit. Nonetheless, Greenblatt asserted that this issue is far more significant than not removing anti-semitic posts and threatening a lawsuit. According to Greenblatt, "This urgent matter is the safety of the Jewish people in the face of increasing, intensifying antisemitism."



Fall From Grace: The Death of Prigozhin

On August 24th, 2023, leader and founder of the Private Military Company (PMC), known as the “Wagner Group,” Yevgeny Prigozhin, was rumored dead following a devastating plane crash over the small Russian village of Tver. On August 27th, Prigozhin, along with the ten other occupants of the aircraft, were officially confirmed dead after a thorough investigation and DNA sampling by Russian authorities. The Kremlin, a nickname used to refer to the broader Russian government, would then release its official ruling on the crash as a freak accident. President Vladimir Putin sent his condolences to the families of the lost souls and his former business partner, Prigozhin.

At first glance, the situation around the crash almost seems cut and dry. However, the investigation conducted by the Russian government has left much to be desired — with minimal information revealed regarding the exact cause of the crash and even less has been done to honor the leaders of PMC Wagner who were extensively involved in the ongoing war in Ukraine. Was this a pre-planned assassination?

PMC Wagner was integral to the Russian war effort in Ukraine, losing 30,000 to capture the city of Bakhmut. Going even further back, PMC Wagner has been involved in multiple conflicts across North Africa, the Middle East, and the Sahel Region (Saharan Africa) since its founding in 2014 — aiding the Russian government and protecting Russian diplomatic, political, and economic interests.

Mere hours following the crash, Wagner-affiliated social media accounts began circulating theories in regards to the downing, claiming the whole event was a preplanned assassination perpetrated by the Russian Government and Russian Internal Security, or FSB. Videos quickly poured out of Russian social media, with Wagner supporters claiming the damage present on the wreckage of the aircraft showed external damage, which would implicate the usage of “Anti-Air” weapons - or weapons with the sole use of being to combat airborne vehicles.

Days later, Prigozhin was unceremoniously buried with no news coverage; being that Prigozhin was awarded a “Hero of the Russian Federation” medal, it is tradition that he would be served with a full military burial. However, this did not happen. This, along with a known Wagner burial ground in Nikolayevka being bull-dozed by Russian authorities, poses many questions about Russia’s future intentions with the Wagner Group and what this could mean for Russia as a whole.



Utah Influencer Arrested for Child Abuse

Around 9:33 pm on August 30th, 2023, influencer, Ruby Franke, was arrested for two counts of child abuse. Just a few days later, she was charged with four additional counts of felony child abuse.

Ruby Franke's 12-year-old son, Russell Franke, was spotted climbing out of a window by a nearby neighbor. According to the neighbor and witnesses, Russell's ankles and wrists were duct-taped together. The child was found with numerous open wounds and was severely malnourished. Once Russell managed to escape his household, he ran to his neighbor's house and begged for food, water, and immediate assistance.

When the local police were called, they began searching the household of Jodi Hildebrant — the infamous business partner of Ruby Franke. Upon their search, they found Ruby's 10-year-old daughter in a similar, devastating condition as Russell. Both children were immediately transported to the hospital, while Ruby Franke and Jodi Hildebrant were both arrested at the scene.

Ruby Franke, mother of six, ran a well-known family YouTube channel by the name of, "8 Passengers," before it was banned. Ruby was infamously known for taking her eldest son's bed away for months — forcing him to sleep on the floor over the duration of months.

Fortunately, her children are getting the justice they deserve, and are openly able to speak out against the abuse they have endured. Further information is still being released, but as of currently, the four children who still lived under Ruby Franke's care have been taken into the care of Utah's Child and Family Services.



Jimmy Buffett

Famous American musician and singer-songwriter, Jimmy Buffett, sadly passed away on September 1st, 2023 at the age of 76. The cause of his death was from Merkel cell cancer, a form of skincare which he had been battling for four years. Even throughout his treatments, he was still touring and performing. He is famously known for his pop music, including his most famous hits, “Margaritaville,” “It’s 5 O’Clock Somewhere” and “Cheeseburger In Paradise.”

He was born in Mississippi and raised in Alabama, where he went to grade school. He formed a small band with his friends where they would play on the streets of New Orleans but then upgraded to playing six nights a week in clubs. Buffett moved to Nashville to work for Billboard magazine, where he began producing music quickly and started touring in 1974.

In 1977, “Margaritaville” was released and was on the Billboard charts for 22 weeks. He has been nominated for Grammys and Country Music Awards, along with television appearances, New York Times bestselling books, and lastly a Broadway play. His favorite out of those accomplishments was performing for his fans, the parrot heads.

Jimmy Buffett’s legacy, influence in the pop music industry, and his love for his fans will always be commemorated.



Gender Reveal Gone Wrong After Plane Crash

He was later charged with endangerment of a child. He was also charged with unlawfully letting a minor drive, and he was charged with having an alcoholic drink open with a minor in the car. The father is now out on bond. The son will not be facing any charges.
