## MAKE-UP ASSIGNMENT POLICY DUE TO ABSENCES

Lahaina Intermediate School values education as a top priority in life.

We believe that in order to have your child succeed in school, classroom presence is an essential component of his/her education.

The State of Hawaii defines the value through the Compulsory Education Law as listed below:

302A-1131, Public Schools; attendance, Hawaii revised statues (HRS), requires a child who is six years of age and not yet eighteen on or before Dec 31 of any school year to attend either a public or private school unless properly excused from school.

302A-1136, Enforcement (HRS) placed the responsibility for enforcing compulsory attendance with the Department of Education (DOE). Students who are chronic absentees may be referred to family court.

Exemption from the compulsory attendance law is permitted only under specified conditions pursuant to 302A-1132, attendance compulsory; exceptions, (HRS), and chapter 12, Hawaii administrative rules, relating to compulsory attendance exceptions.

\*\*The Department of Education, Hawaii Administrative Rules, Chapter 8, Subtitle 2 Education Chapter 12, Exceptions to Compulsory Education, For DLTSS 4140, must be completed and approved by the School Administrator and the Complex Area Superintendent.

In Alignment with the Lahaina Intermediate School's statement: effective immediately:

- Students may refer directly to their teacher's Google Classroom for updated assignments and email them through the site for additional information.
- Phone requests for assignments will be honored after the third day of absence. (Please refer to your teacher's course syllabi for individual teacher details concerning this matter).
- Upon returning from an absence, the student must see his/her teacher for missing assignments. Teachers must provide missing assignments upon students' request.
- Make-up assignments for absences incurred by vacations taken while school is in session will not be provided.
