Santa Barbara County School Safety Symposium

SBCEO convened the Santa Barbara County School Safety Symposium (day 1) on September 25. Speakers from the FBI, Los Angeles Police Department, Santa Barbara Sheriff's Office, the District Attorney, and local school districts presented to an audience of public and private TK-12 schools and preschools, community colleges and universities, law enforcement and emergency services.

In addition to employees from public and private TK-12 schools and preschools, in attendance were employees from Santa Barbara City College, Allan Hancock College, UC Santa Barbara, fire, police, sheriff, Office of Emergency Management, SBCEO, and the County of Santa Barbara.

With financial support from the County of Santa Barbara, County Fire, and the Sheriff's Department, SBCEO provided this symposium at no cost for attendees. We look forward to facilitating day 2, which will focus on the Standard Response Protocol we will use in the event of school-related emergencies.

SBCEO DIVISIONS

Administrative Services Division

District Budget Approval: School Business Advisory Services' district financial advisors completed their review of districts' 2023-24 adopted budgets for compliance with state criteria and standards and to determine if the budgets allow the districts to meet their financial obligations. The budgets for all 20 school districts were approved on or before September 15, 2023.

Fiscal Year Close Out: The Internal Services department closed out the 2022-23 fiscal year and completed the required SACS Unaudited Actuals report. This year-end data

will form the basis for the 2022-23 annual financial report and provide actual beginning fund balances that will be loaded into the First Interim report.

Curriculum and Instruction Division

LCAP Review and Approval: All 20 district LCAPs have been reviewed and approved prior to the October 8 deadline. They are being posted on the SBCEO website. This year's Education Omnibus Trailer Bill added new requirements for the latest iteration of the LCAP template as well as a requirement for a midyear update. The newest LCAP template will be approved at the November State Board of Education meeting. Members of the C&I team have been working with the CDE to provide feedback and support for streamlining and coherence in the development of the new template. We rolled out the training plans with the Curriculum Council in September.

CalMSCS Statewide Grant Rollout: The California Mathematics, Science, and Computer Science Partnership (CAL-MSCS) is a comprehensive, multi-agency system designed to provide a sustainable, impactful professional learning infrastructure for mathematics, science, and computer science educators across the state. With partners, San Joaquin County Office of Education (science) and Monterey County Office of Education (computer science), SBCEO is the lead for mathematics on the [CalMSCS project](#). We are building statewide and local communities of practice for professional learning and implementation in all 58 counties in California for grades 4-12, with a complementary grant housed at the Fresno County office for birth through age 8 in these subjects. Associate Superintendent Ellen Barger and Director Lauren Aranguren lead this initiative. SBCEO will host the first in-person convening of the Mathematics Steering Committee on Tuesday, October 3 with 25 leaders from across the state.

Differentiated Assistance (DA): Ongoing Support: Our school and district support team continues to meet with our individual districts to monitor and support the implementation of their focus areas determined in the spring DA process. Additionally, the superintendents throughout the county agreed to work together on improving systems and outcomes for students with disabilities. SELPA Executive Director Dr. Ray Avila is a member of the SBCEO DA team and will continue to partner on this work with general educators and special educators. We will be engaging with Kevin Schaefer from the Systems Improvement Lead of the CA statewide system of support, who specializes in inclusivity and neurodiversity. District teams will kick off this work with Kevin Schaefer on October 24.

Language and Literacy: World Languages Day: On October 26, SBCEO will host our first ever [World Languages Day](#). With the recent release of new World Languages instructional materials, participants and district teams will engage with the latest standards and framework, receive an orientation to the Materials Adoption Toolkit, and explore offerings from publishers and vendors. Director Dr. Carlos Pagán and Coordinator Melissa Garcia will host this event and provide the training.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) Fall Professional Learning Series: Directors Tiffany Carson and Cate Tolnai have been hosting a [series of free afterschool virtual workshops](#) for educators to explore the impact of AI on teaching and learning, ethics, and educational systems. The in-person leadership summit will be held Wednesday, October 4 at the SBCEO Auditorium with special guest Kat Goyette, CDE computer science coordinator. The day-long event will explore systems, policies, bias, ethics and data privacy as well as ways to support educators' and students' exploration and use of AI tools.

Academic Events: Breakfast with the Authors: Our [71st Breakfast with the Authors](#) will take place on Saturday, October 21 from 9:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. in the SBCEO Auditorium. This unique event unites book lovers, including teachers, families, librarians, and community members connecting, over breakfast, with authors and illustrators of children's and YA (young adult) literature. This year's theme centers around setting and how the authors create time and place. The event includes panel discussions, individual presentations, and opportunities to have beloved authors sign their books.

A Salute to Teachers – November 4: The 10th annual [Salute to Teachers](#) will be held at the Music Academy on Saturday November 4, 2023, at 5:00 p.m. This special teacher recognition pays tribute to individual awardees and to the entire teaching profession. Video highlights and acceptance remarks from each honoree precede a festive reception and celebration. The evening will feature Santa Barbara County Teacher of the Year Greg Wolf, Performing Arts Teacher of the Year Elesa Carlson, three Distinguished Mentor Teachers – Victoria Aguirre, Natalie Durbin, and Tiffany Gonzales, and 3 Distinguished New Educators – Ryan Helsel, Sammi Lambert, and Julio Molina. Thanks to the generosity of our sponsors, the event is free for all invited guests, including honorees and their families, teachers, principals, superintendents, board members and community members.

Special Education Division

Two classrooms at the new Casmalia preschool location opened to students and families this fall. The facility is currently serving 22 preschool students. A third classroom is scheduled to open in October. The facility will eventually serve up to 54 preschool students in the Santa Maria and Orcutt communities.

In Lompoc, a new preschool classroom opened at Crestview Elementary on the Vandenberg Space Force Base. This class will eventually support up to 20 students.

On September 7, 64 certificated and classified Special Education staff participated in a virtual professional development session with Dr. Rosy Bucio, Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) for Santa Barbara County SELPA. This training continues the year-long seminar series involving synchronous training, asynchronous training and content, and in-vivo coaching sessions with Dr. Bucio in selected programs. The seminar series provides Special Education staff with additional techniques to support students with

behavioral needs through evidenced-based practices grounded in the latest research related to neuroscience and development.

On October 18, Vandenberg Space Force Base will host their fall Job Fair. This event is an opportunity for employers, nonprofits, and agencies in the Lompoc area to offer their current employment opportunities for the spouses of the airmen and airwomen. Staff from the SBCEO Special Education division and Human Resources division will attend.

Student and Community Services Division

Career Technical Education (CTE)

North County Teacher Tours: The first north county teacher tour took place on September 6, with seven Santa Maria Joint Union High School District family and consumer science teachers participating. The tour included visits to local businesses, including the Santa Maria Inn, Testa's Catering, and the Maya Mexican Restaurant. We look forward to our next teacher tour on October 4, which is intended for CTE teachers of the following industry sectors: engineering, manufacturing & product development, architecture, and construction. For this tour, CTE is working with the Santa Maria Valley Chamber of Commerce to identify local businesses to be included.

South County Teacher Tours: Sarah Cameron, SBCEO CTE director, has begun the conversation with the South Coast Chamber of Commerce to collaborate on south county teacher tours. To kick off the collaboration this year, CTE is supporting a partnership that is developing between Workforce Development, UCSB, South Coast Chamber of Commerce, and Carpinteria High School (CHS). At the request of the principal at CHS, a special tour for his staff, the superintendent, and board members has been arranged to visit local technology industries.

Early Childhood Education Apprenticeship Program Update: CTE is excited to announce that three apprentices have officially enrolled in the SBCEO Early Childhood Education Apprenticeship Program. Apprentices are paired with a mentor at their assigned SBCEO preschool site and a counselor at Cerro Coso Community College, where they will complete their online classes. Through grant funds, apprentices are provided with school materials, including a laptop and Wi-Fi hotspot, at no cost. This program's goal is to increase the number of qualified preschool teachers in Santa Barbara County.

Children's Creative Project (CCP)

In partnership with the Santa Barbara Bowl, CCP will host a special LADAMA performance on October 3 at 10:45 a.m., offering 4th through 12th grade students with a free concert at the Bowl.

Kai Tepper, the executive director of CCP, is actively involved in networking and leadership initiatives, including participation in the California County Superintendents Arts Initiative and the "Arts Now" leadership program. Over the past two years, CCP has

doubled both its programming and staff. This expansion translates into increased resources and educational opportunities for schools and students.

Children and Family Resource Services (CFRS)

Health Programs and Screenings at Local Schools: A variety of health programs and screenings have been scheduled to take place at school sites this year: Franklin Elementary and Harding Elementary (SBUSD) will receive dental sealants from Santa Barbara Neighborhood Clinics Family Dental. Mary Buren Elementary (Guadalupe USD) will also receive dental treatment through referrals to a program in Guadalupe. In addition, the **Fluoride Varnish Project** will serve 67 different sites with varnish application and 21 state preschools will participate in comprehensive health screenings. Lastly, **Future Smiles**, the orthodontia program, will provide free braces to 133 youth. CFRS will be putting together a fundraising campaign in the coming months to fundraise for 37 additional students to receive free braces.

Promotores Projects and Recognitions: The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) Foundation recently recognized the Promotores for their work during the pandemic in the Cuyama area. In addition, CenCal Health has recognized the expertise of the CFRS department in supporting the community with healthcare needs and has contracted with them to begin providing more services using Promotores trained to be community health workers.

Juvenile Court and Community Schools (JCCS)

FitzGerald Community School Meet & Greet: On September 20, 2023, FitzGerald's staff opened their doors to parents and families, inviting them to get a firsthand glimpse of their child's daily experience at the school. During this event, parents had the opportunity to discover the various resources and support available at FitzGerald, including valuable partnerships with organizations like the Family Service Agency (FSA), Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse (CADA), Health Navigators, and the Promotores Network.

Transitional Youth Services (TYS)

Supporting District Liaisons: To support foster and homeless liaisons across the county's school districts, an upcoming liaison meeting is scheduled for early October. This meeting aims to offer professional development opportunities and facilitate the exchange of best practices in assisting foster and homeless students within schools. In addition, TYS staff has recently distributed sample student supply kits to all local school districts. These kits contain a variety of school supplies, socks, water bottles, and feminine hygiene products.

The certificated and classified personnel reports are provided to the board as an information item.

Certificated Personnel Report

Certificated employees are those whose positions require a specific credential issued by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing.

The certificated personnel report is generated regularly and includes all actions made regarding employment of certificated employees at SBCEO such as appointments and separations.

Classified Personnel Report

Classified employees are those whose positions do not require a state-issued credential. Since 1975, the Santa Barbara County Education Office has operated a Merit System for the classified service. Merit System law (Education Code § 45240-45320) provides that classified employees are selected, retained and promoted on the basis of merit and fitness, exclusive of discrimination due to actual or perceived race, color, ethnicity, age, religion, political affiliation, marital status, disability, gender, sexual orientation or national origin. The Personnel Commission, composed of three members, is the impartial body authorized by the state to be responsible for implementing and interpreting Merit System rules and adjudicating appeals on those facets of employment within its purview.

The classified personnel report is typically generated monthly and includes all personnel actions affecting classified employees at SBCEO such as appointments, changes to status, and separations.
