Window Film

- Windows were coated with a shatter resistant film in strategic places.

- Inspected routinely throughout the day and before the security alarms are activated each evening
- Card access is on all primary entrance doors
- Bollards installed at all key entrances.

Social and Emotional Supports

Nationally, 63% of children have faced some form of adverse childhood experience (ACE)

At the Region, State and National levels middle school aged children are experiencing the greatest increase in emotional challenges

Uplift: UPLIFT is a train-the-trainer program that is trauma-informed, resilience-focused, and individualized to meet the unique systemic needs of a school or district.

RESC Alliance Regional Trauma Coordinators provide training, technical assistance, and consultation to public school districts at no cost.

The training program includes four modules:

- Trauma-Informed Care (101)
- Trauma-Informed Care Leadership Orientation
- Staff and System Wellness
- Trauma-Informed Care in Practice (6 Part) Series



Connecticut Center for School Safety and Security

Began working with them in the Fall of 2022





Upgraded Surveillance

One of the challenges with measuring the results of our safety and security work is that when we are effective, we establish conditions where events are avoided.

Funding Sources for Security
