## Fred Golden Coach

**1973-1985**

Coach Fred Golden Jr. served as the head Track and Field Coach at Seneca High School from 1973 until 1985 after coaching football and track at Blue Ridge High School before the schools merged. Coach Golden produced 5 consecutive Region Championship teams from 1976 until 1980, and four State Runner Up in 1977, 1981, 1984 and 1985. He coached 40 individual Region Champions and 12 individual State Champions between 1976 and 1986, and is known for bringing the track and field program at Seneca High School up to a top level program which has remained at that level until today. He earned Region Coach of the Year honors in 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979, 1980, 1981, 1983 and 1985, and state Coach of the Year honors in 1978. Coach Golden started the Cross Country program here at Seneca High in 1980, and coached the team in 1980 and 1982. He moved on to serve as assistant principal in 1983 and stayed in that role until 1995. At Blue Ridge, he was an assistant football coach and the head Girls Basketball coach as well as the head track coach from 1963-1969.

## Hollis Hall Athlete

**1974-1978**

Hollis Hall is a 1978 graduate of Seneca High School who lettered in both football and baseball in his time as a Bobcat. He was a four year letter-winner for the baseball team, winning the team MVP award in his senior year. He was a three year letter-winner in football, earning All Region honors and team MVP in his senior year. Hollis signed to play football at Clemson University from 1979 to 1983, and was 4th in the ACC in punt returns in 1979. He was a 3 year letterman at Clemson as a cornerback and finished his career as a team captain. He played in the 1978 Gator Bowl, the 1979 Peach Bowl, and the 1982 Orange Bowl where the Tigers won the National Championship. He moved on to play for the San Diego Chargers, the Houston Gamblers, and the Arizona State Wranglers. In 1983 he started nine of 15 games for the Wranglers and recorded 46 tackles, two interceptions, one fumble recovery, and six deflected passes. In 1984 he started 8 games for the Gamblers and was credited with 50 solo tackles, 15 assists, and one interception for 12 yards.

# Aleca Queen (Johnson) Athlete 1997-2001

Aleca Johnson Queen is a 2001 graduate of Seneca High School. She is a six year letter-winner in softball, and was our starting pitcher for the majority of that time. In her time as a Bobcat, Aleca was a member of 4 Region Championship teams, 3 Upper State Championship teams, and 2 AAA State Championship teams (1999, 2001). She was selected to the Region 1-AAA All-Region team 5 times, and the AAA All-State team 4 times in her career, and was named the Region 1-AAA Player of the Year 4 times, and AAA State Player of the Year 3 times. She held the state record for most wins in a career (124- this record still stands), most shutouts in a season (2) and most strikeouts in a season (325) and career (1321). She is a two time Gatoraide S.C. State Player of the Year, and 3 time Louisville Slugger NFCA All American (2 times 1st team, 1 time 2nd team). She signed a full athletic scholarship to the University of South Carolina in 2001, and played 4 years there while earning her undergraduate degree. She finished the 2002 season tied for sixth in the country in saves (6), and in 2002 earned All-Regional Tournament team honors. At the time of her induction, she was USC's all time leader in saves (18). After graduation, she served as an assistant softball coach for Seneca Softball's 2006 state championship, and also coached at the University of North Carolina at Pembroke in 2007.

# Charles "Dubby"

## Robinson

### Athlete

1954-1958

Charles "Dubby" Robinson is a 1958 graduate of Seneca High School. He lettered in four sports in his time as a Bobcat- football (4), basketball (5), track and field (4) and baseball (2). He was the starting quarterback for the Bobcats for 3 years, making the All Conference and All State teams all three years. In his senior year, he was selected to the North-South All Star game and the Shrine Bowl of the Carolinas team. He signed a football scholarship to Clemson University, but was unable to play after a knee injury. He lettered in basketball for four years, and was the leading scorer for the Bobcats, and in the Skyline conference for 2 years. He made the All State team for three years, and was named to the All Southern team. Dubby went on to work at Oconee Savings and Loan in Seneca before retiring after 40 years.

## Eddie Wright Athlete

**1978-1982**

Eddie Wright is a 1982 graduate of Seneca High School. He was a varsity letter-winner in basketball (3), cross country (3) and track and field (4). Eddie was the AAA state champion in the 800 meters in 1981 and 1982, the 1 mile run in 1981 and 1982, and the 2 mile run in 1982. He was the AAA Upper State Champion in the 1 mile in 1981, and the 2 mile in 1980 and 1981. He was the Region 1-AAA champion in the 2 mile for 3 years (1980-1982), the 1 mile for 2 years (1981-1982), and the 880 yard run in 1982. He added AAU state championships to his resume by winning the 1500m and 3000 m in 1981 and 1982. Eddie was the first athlete in South Carolina High School history to win all 3 distance races at the state finals, a feat that had only been repeated once as of his induction. Eddie was an AAU and TAC State Cross Country champion in 1981 and 1982, was a Kinney Shoes All-American in Cross Country in 1981, and an AAU All-American honorable mention in Track and Field in 1982. He has held school records in all three distance races for 28 years and counting as of his induction in 2010. He went on to serve in the US Air Force from 1984-1994, and was employed by E\*TRADE Financial services.
