CORE Values

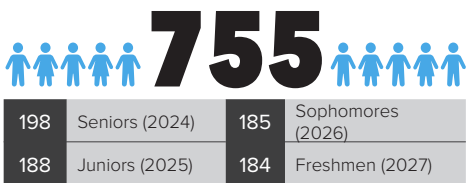

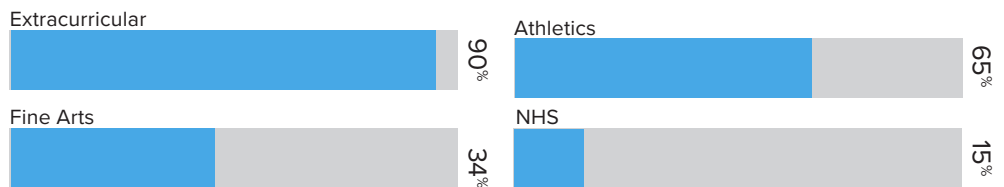
Accreditation and Memberships

Our Student Support Services (SSS) programs are also fully endorsed by the All Belong Center for Inclusive Education.

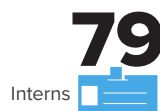
Student Involvement

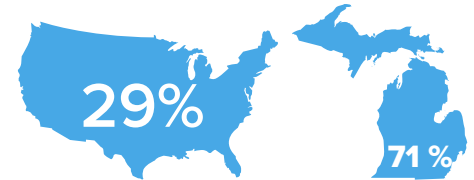
