Patsy Johnson is a 1982 graduate of Seneca High School, who lettered for 4 years each in volleyball and basketball. In her four years as a Ladycat, Patsy made the All Region Team 4 times in basketball, and was named to the All State Team in 1980, 1981, and 1982. She scored a total of 1,551 points in her time at Seneca over the course of 93 games, averaging 16.7 points per game. Both of these stats were school records that stayed on the books until 1995. Her season best records for total points (503) and points per game (21.9) were also school records that were not broken until the 2000-2001 school year. She still holds the school record for rebounds in a game with 30. In the pre-upper state game in 1980, the Lady Cats trailed going into the 4th quarter to Southside who was 22-0 and ranked #1 in the State. Patsy scored 16 points and pulled down every rebound on both ends of the game to send the Cats into the upper state championship game.

Michael Parker

Michael Parker is a 1977 graduate of Seneca High School, he earned 10 varsity letters in his time as a Bobcat including 4 letters in track & field, 3 letters in basketball, and 3 letters in football. At one point in his career, Michael simultaneously held 5 school records in Track and Field including the long jump, triple jump, 110 meter hurdles, 180 yard hurdles, and 300 meter hurdles. He earned the first ever state championship in track and field by a Seneca High School student winning the AAA State Long Jump in 1976 and 1977. In 1977, he qualified for the state championship in 4 individual events, finishing with 1 gold, 2 silvers and a bronze medal and scoring 32 individual points, the highest individual score of the meet that year. He earned All Conference honors for 4 years, and All-State honors in the Long Jump in 1976 and 1977. Michael won 4 total individual conference championships, 2 in the long jump and 2 in the triple jump, and was the leading point getter for the team from 1974-1977. After earning a scholarship to Baptist College at Charleston (not Charleston Southern), he continued his level of performance earning several long jump titles including a bronze medal in the Penn Relays of 1979.
