Forms of Academic Assessments	Northside Elementary School has common formative assessments that every teacher gives in grades 3rd - 5th No matter the teacher, each child is assessed via the same assessment provided by TEKS Resource System which models each assessment after the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness or STAAR test. Previous STAAR tests are released and utilized for assessment and instruction in addition to other curriculums.

Each child has a fo-lder where teachers help them track their own learning growth.
