## TITLE: TRANSPORTATION-BUS MECHANIC

## QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. High School Diploma supplemented by gas and diesel mechanical experience.
- 2. Thorough knowledge of vehicle maintenance methods, equipment, and techniques.
- 3. Familiarity with engine, electrical, chassis, brake, clutch, transmission, carburetor, pollution control equipment, and other vehicle component maintenance.
- 4. Knowledge of mechanical tools such as testing equipment, power tools, welding equipment, and diagnostic programs.
- 5. Excellent driving skills and possess a Missouri CDL or the ability to obtain a CDL with school bus and air brake.
- 6. Social skills, willing to work independently or as a team, quick learner.
- 7. Ability to pass mandatory random drug testing.
- REPORTS TO: Bus Mechanic Foreman and/or Director of Transportation/Asst. Superintendent of Operations.
- JOB GOAL: To provide maintenance service to the transportation system of the District by performing all levels of maintenance and by doing so, keep all vehicles operating in a safe and efficient manner.

## PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Perform basic trouble-shooting duties and repairs on buses and other school district vehicles such as vans, trucks, tractors, including repairs on clutch and transmission; performs upholstery and welding tasks as needed.
- 2. Perform preventative maintenance as needed.
- 3. Inspects and diagnoses vehicles to ensure they meet State standards; prepares buses for annual inspection.
- 4. Responds to vehicle breakdowns; repairs vehicles on site when possible or takes corrective action.
- 5. Acts as lead person in the physical maintenance of vehicles.
- 6. The ability to obtain the S&P endorsements.
- Performs other duties as necessary such as cleaning vehicles and shop and fixing small equipment for the district.
- PHYSICAL DEMANDS: Regularly lifts parts up to 150 pounds; ability to work in confined spaces for lengthy periods of time; repeated turning/twisting motions with all joints and waist; repeated push/pull on fingers, hands, wrists, shoulders, elbows and back; ability to stand in one location for up to one hour while working on equipment; climbing up and down on bus hoods and ladders; reaching and working with hands over head; repeated movements to and from

the floor; standing and walking on concrete for up to 8 hours.
