How do I start the ADR process?

If the IEP team is not able to reach an agreement, inform the IEP team that you are requesting ADR. Then contact the City of San Bernardino USD SELPA at 909-880-6860 and ask to speak to ADR staff or email

How much does it cost?

ADR options are provided at no cost.

Is local ADR mandatory?

No, local ADR sessions are voluntary and based on both parties wanting to reach a fair and equitable agreement. Parents and districts are free to withdraw from the process.

Do I need a lawyer, an advocate, or can I bring someone to support the process?

While you can bring anyone to the meeting, we are happy to provide support within the district to help you with the ADR process.
