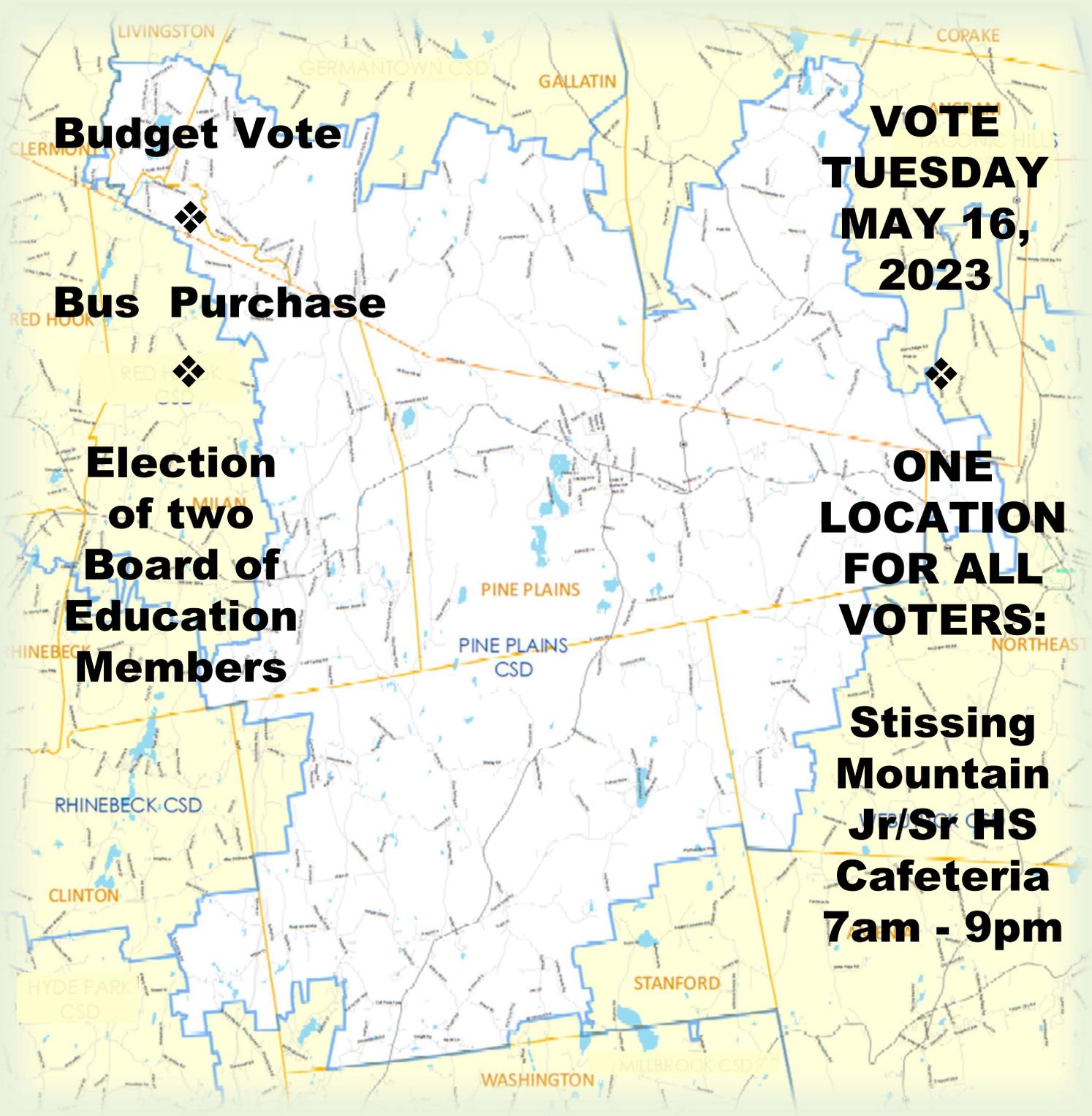

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS  
2023-2024 BUDGET**

The annual budget vote for the fiscal year 2023-2024 by the qualified voters of the Pine Plains Central School District, Dutchess and Columbia Counties, New York, will be held on Tuesday, May 16, 2023 between the hours of 7:00 AM and 9:00 PM prevailing time.

**POLLING PLACE:**

**ONE LOCATION FOR ALL DISTRICT RESIDENTS**

**All district residents vote at the Stissing Mountain Middle / High School Cafeteria, Pine Plains, New York from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.**

**VOTERS SHALL BE ASKED TO VOTE ON THE FOLLOWING:**

**PROPOSITION NUMBER ONE**

**RESOLVED**, that the Board of Education of the Pine Plains Central School District be authorized to expend the sum of \$36,415,211 for School District purposes for the 2023-2024 school year and to levy the necessary tax therefor.

**PROPOSITION NUMBER TWO: BUS PURCHASE RESOLUTION**

**SHALL** the Board of Education of the Pine Plains Central School District, Dutchess and Columbia Counties, New York, be authorized to purchase Two (2) 71-passenger school buses, including cameras and necessary equipment, at a maximum estimated cost of \$151,997 each, for an aggregate maximum estimated cost of \$303,994; and that the sum of \$303,994, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District and collected in annual installments as provided in Section 416 of the Education Law; and in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District may be issued?

**ELECTION OF TWO BOARD OF EDUCATION MEMBERS**

The election is for two (2) members of the Board of Education for three-year terms commencing July 1, 2023 and ending on June 30, 2026. Two candidates are running for the two seats on the Board of Education this year: James Griffin and Heidi Johnson. You may vote for up to two (2) candidates on May 16, 2023.

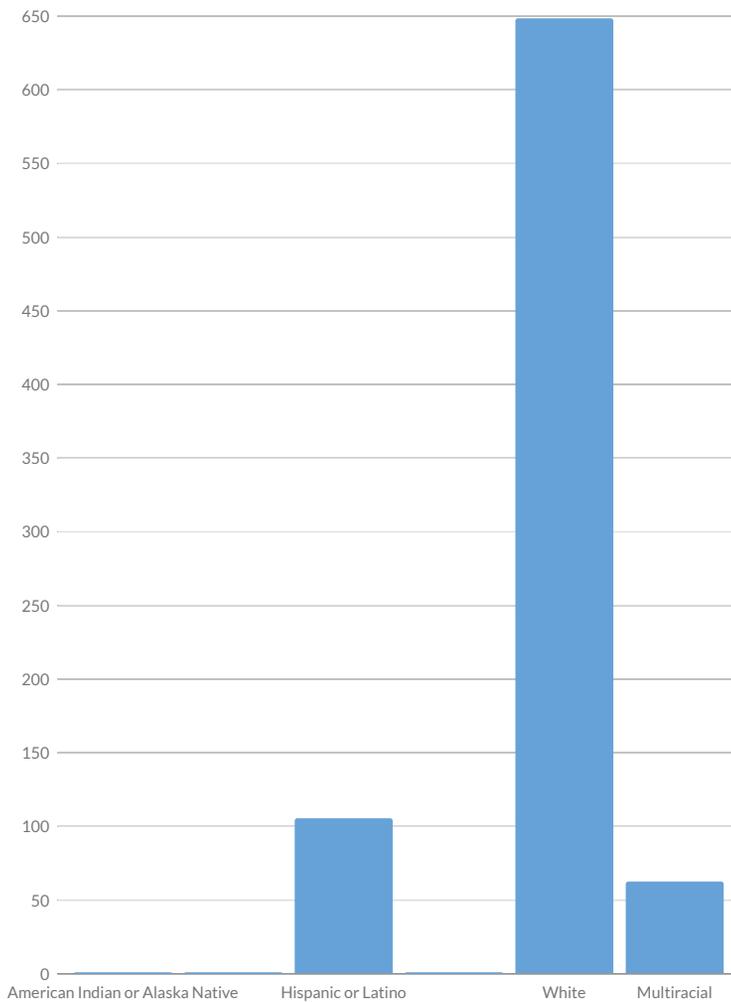

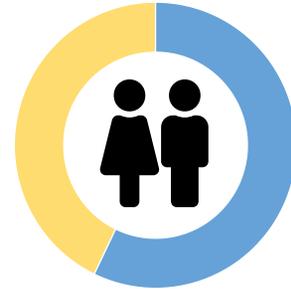

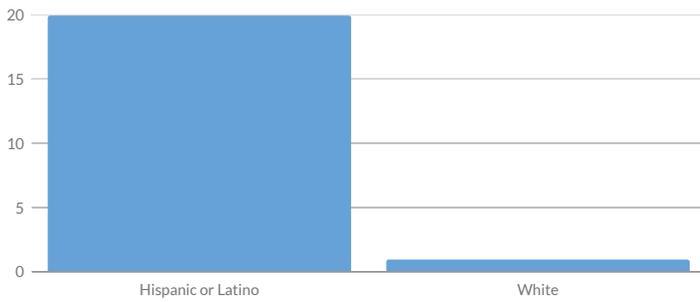
**PINE PLAINS CSD ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS ENROLLMENT

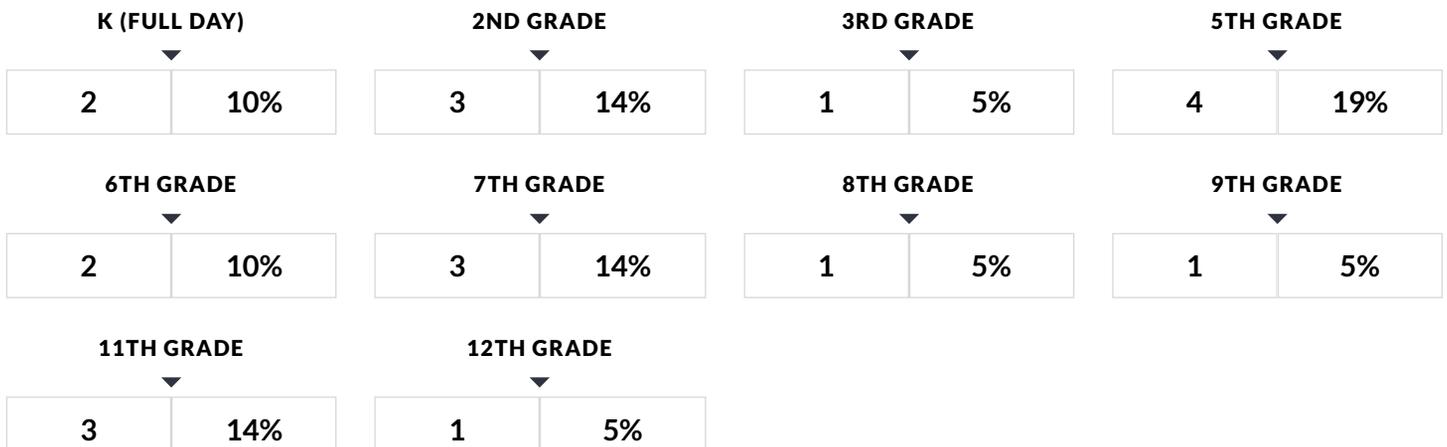
**ELL ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY**
