Each month information will be shared about what your child is learning in school. This will be an overview of topics being learned; please contact your child's teacher for more details as needed. If you have special talents or knowledge of a topic to be studied that you would like to share, please reach out to your child's teacher. We would love for you to share in our students' learning!

## All Grades

In September, all students participated in the following:

* Benchmark assessments on iReady for reading and math
* Individually administered reading inventory assessment (F\&P Benchmarking System)
* Be BLUE lessons for expectations in all areas of the school, safety routines and procedures
* Learning google classroom, Clever and other technology tools

Grade 3: For Math, we will use the commutative and distributive properties to utilize related facts, units of 2,3 , and 4 to solve larger multiplication and division problems. We will then begin working with Measurement and Data as we learn to tell time on analog clocks and calculate elapsed time. After studying characters and character traits, we will dive into our first novel, Because of Winn Dixie! We will apply all of our lessons on character study, story elements, and responding to text- based questions as we enjoy this beloved text as a class.

Grade 4: This month fourth graders will begin to learn about the Haudenosaunee! Students will read, write and learn about their traditions, rituals and how they worked together. They will also focus on main idea and supporting details. In math students will begin to add and subtract multi-digit numbers. For science, students will learn about waves! They will investigate how a wave is initiated and how they travel. Continue to read and practice math facts each night.

Grade 5: The 5th grade has started off the year strong and they are already hard at work! We have begun the novel, Number the Stars by Lois Lowry which tells the story of 10-year-old Annemarie, who is living through the German occupation of Denmark during World War II. Students have been applying their knowledge of story elements, plot diagrams, vocabulary, and foundational skills throughout their reading and are excited to jump into their first fifth grade novel! Our first writing unit examines narratives where students are asked to solidify their fundamental writing skills such as capitalization, punctuation, dialogue, and sentence structure in order to tell a complete story! Students have had fun being creative with their writing and identifying where these elements are present in their everyday lives! We are working through Module 1 of math which examines place value and decimal fractions. Students have had lots of opportunities to engage with science already this year! We have completed our first investigation that asks students to demonstrate the life cycle of a bullfrog, bean plant, and eastern bluebird. Students enjoyed building background knowledge on animal life cycles and being able to apply that to this first investigation.

It can be hard to know when to send children to school if they tell you that they do not feel well. Usually, the best place for them is in school, but there are times when keeping them home to rest or call for an appointment
 Please keep your child home and/or contact your child's doctor for:

Fever greater than 100.4*

Continuous productive cough and/or large amount of mucus from their nose

Severe sore throat along with fever and feeling ill for more than 48 hours, or after exposure to Strep throat infection

Severe headache, especially with fever

Vomiting and/or Diarrhea within the last 24 hours.

Honey-crusted sores around the nose or mouth or rash on other body parts

Severe ear pain or fluid coming from the ear or eye

Positive COVID-19 test, with or without symptoms *
with your health care provider is recommended.


Your Child May Return When:

*Children must be fever free for 24 hours without the use of medication prior to their return. If medication was prescribed by provider, they will need to have been on the medicine for 24 hours prior to return.
*If COVID-19 positive, student must complete a 5 day isolation, may return on day 6 as long as symptoms have improved and they have been fever free for at least 24 hours without medication. They must wear a well-fitting mask days $6-10$ upon return to school.
