Say Something Anonymous Reporting System



The national nonprofit, Sandy Hook Promise (SHP), developed the Say Something Anonymous Reporting System (SS-ARS). The system allows youth and adults to securely submit

anonymous safety concerns – anytime, from anywhere – to help identify and intervene upon at-risk individuals before they hurt themselves or others. The system enables school administrators and law enforcement to create effective interventions and to help prevent violence, suicide, bullying, self-harm and other forms of threatening behavior.

Designed specifically for use by students in grades 6-12, SS-ARS provides three reporting platforms (mobile app, website, 24/7 phone hotline) for users to submit tips – and a crisis center to examine and triage those tips. When credible tips are received, the crisis center will notify school-based representatives, even after hours when tips are life-threatening and require immediate intervention. In cases of imminent threat, the crisis center will contact local 911 dispatch and involve law enforcement.

Middle School Attendance Office Procedures

Here are some reminders to help you when your student is absent from school.

-  If your student is **absent from school**, please call the Attendance Office at 330-875-5597, option 1 before 9:00am, spell their first and last name, what grade they are in and the reason they are off. You do not need to send in a note if you have left a message or spoken to the secretary
-  If they have an upcoming **appointment**, please send in a note with the student's full name printed neatly, the date, time of pick up and the reason for leaving and give to their 1st period teacher. If you bring back an excuse from the doctor/physician/dentist's office, it will go on their record as Medical, which is better towards their attendance
-  When a **student leaves during school hours**, a parent/guardian who is eligible, must come in to the Attendance office, Door 1A, with their driver's license, to check them out. The student will sign out on the Chromebook in the Attendance Office before he/she is dismissed
-  If your student **does not feel well**, they must first go to the Main Office to be assessed, the nurse or secretary will call the parent/guardian to have them picked up at the Attendance Office. STUDENTS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO BE ON THEIR CELL PHONES DURING SCHOOL HOURS WITHOUT THE PERMISSION OF A STAFF MEMBER!
-  If **dropping off your student** after the bell rings (7:30am), parents/guardians do NOT need to come in, but the student must enter the Attendance Office and sign in on the Chromebook to get a pass to go to class
-  When **dropping off an item** your student left at home, please bring it to the Attendance Office and put a sticky note on it with their full name & it will be delivered to them
-  When you are planning **Vacation** or participating in the **Stark Co. Fair**, you must pick up a purple form in the Attendance Office and it needs to be signed by all their teachers, along with the Assistant Principal, Guidance Office, a Parent and the student. When complete, return it to the Attendance Office
-  To access your homework, log into your Schoology account from your Chromebook or on any computer. You may also e-mail the student's teachers at any time.
