Q: How do I put money in my child's account?

A: Visit the Wausau School District website, select the "nutrition department" and then select "LINQconnect" to register and be able to put money into your child's account using a credit card. You may also send cash or check with your child in an envelope with your child's name on it as well as their grade. The envelope should be placed in the drop box labeled: Nutrition Services Meal Payments, located to the left of the Business Office window.

Q: Why didn't I hear back after I filled out the Free and Reduced Application that I completed?

A: If you qualify for F/R meals based on an application, we will send you either an email OR a paper letter. *If* you qualify for Free or Reduced and *if* you provided an email, we will use that method of communication first, so please check your spam folder

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE Registration for the May 2024 IB Exams

Registration for the May 2024 IB exams opened **September 25**, and will run through October 25. Be sure to mark your calendars because this is the only time for IB exam registration. Eligible students will complete a registration form through google forms that will be emailed to them. The fee for each IB exam is \$119. Payments can be made with a credit or debit card through the Infinite Campus Parent Portal or by a check made out to Wausau East High School. **Registration fees are not refundable**.

Examinations will be administered in accordance with IB regulations. The exam dates are not negotiable. As a result, exams take priority over other school activities.

The <u>IB Exam schedule for the May 2024 session</u>, and other information about the registration process, will be shared with students in IB classes eligible to test. Emails from Campus Messenger with registration information will also be sent to the parents and students in these classes.

Who is eligible to register?

Anyone who is enrolled in an IB class, and is in good academic standing, can take the IB exam in that subject. For all higher level (HL) and some standard level (SL) courses, students would need to complete both years of instruction to be eligible to take the exam.

Should your junior or senior student register for the IB exams?

Students enrolled in an IB class have already chosen to take on an academic challenge. These classes are designed to teach the skills required to work with the content at the college level, including critical thinking and research methods. They also develop communication, organizational, and time management skills.

Extending that challenge to include taking the IB exam may provide additional benefits:

- Certainly, many consider that their performance on the exam may earn them credits at the college/ university they plan on attending. Be a wise consumer and check the IB credit policies of the colleges the student might attend.
- Also consider that having committed to taking the exam may keep students more focused throughout the year.
- Imagine the gratification and confidence a student could gain after taking a college level exam and performing admirably when their results are compared to tens of thousands of students from around the world!
- Students who are IB Diploma Candidates must take six IB exams over their junior and senior years. **If you have questions:**
- Stop by the IB Resource Center, next to the JackShack, during parent conferences on October 12, to pick up handouts that will explain the IB Exam Registration process.



HEALTH SERVICES NEWS

Information Regarding Your Child & Illness

IMPORTANT: If your child is feeling ill during the school day, please have them report to the Health Office. We will contact you (parent/guardian) to make arrangements for them to be picked up.

Please follow these guidelines from the WSD for illnesses:

Students may be excluded from school for communicable disease control for the following conditions:

- Undiagnosed or untreated skin rash or sores that cannot be covered
- Fever (temperature 100.4°F or greater or if behaviors such as excessive sleepiness or coughing which might be interfering with the student's learning). Child must be fever-free without fever medicine for 24 hours before returning to school
- Vomiting **more than once** in the previous 24 hours. Child must not have vomited in the past 24 hours before returning to school.
- Diarrhea three times in the previous 24 hours or child is incontinent (has an "accident")
- Upper respiratory illness with **frequent** cough/drainage
- "Pinkeye" (conjunctivitis) if accompanied by fever, behavioral change or inability to avoid touching eyes. (Antibiotics not required for return).
- Strep throat (until 24 hours after treatment has begun, or health practitioner approval)
- Students whose immunization status is not in compliance with the Wisconsin Immunization Law
- Students with known suppressed immunity may be excluded, for their protection, when cases of communicable disease (i.e., measles, chickenpox) occur in school

Please contact the East Health Office if your child has Covid. They should remain home following the guidelines listed above. Their absence will be marked accordingly. We will not quarantine students.



A limited number of Covid tests are available in the Health Office. You may request one at any time.

A reminder that all medication, prescription or over-the-counter, (i.e., ibuprofen, Tylenol, Tums, cold medication) must be kept in the Health Office during the school day. Students may carry emergency medication, inhalers, diabetic supplies, and cough drops if needed.

<u>COLLEGE BOUND? YOU MAY WANT TO CONSIDER INCLUDING</u> YOUR ACT OR SAT RESULTS



Many colleges, including all the UW's, are test-optional, meaning that the ACT or SAT is not required for admission. The ACT and SAT are standardized tests that students can choose to include with their college application for admission. If you would like to discuss whether you should include your test score, please see your counselor or Mrs. Gauger. Keep in mind that some scholarships may require applicants to submit an ACT or SAT score. To see upcoming test dates and register, utilize the following links: <u>ACT</u> or <u>SAT</u>

NOTE: The ACT has an optional writing test. It is important for students to check if the college(s) requires the writing test prior to registering to take the test since not all schools require it. The SAT has a writing section that is included as part of the test so all students who take the SAT will take the writing component.

MID-TERM GRADUATION



Seniors who are planning to graduate in January should meet with their counselor to verify they will meet all graduation requirements by the end of first semester. They will also need to complete a Mid-Term Graduation Application and submit it to the counseling office by December 1.



UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN COLLEGES

The UW System is now accepting applications! The standard <u>online application</u> is user friendly and can be used to apply to more than one campus. The following UW universities charge an application fee for every application submitted: UW-Eau Claire (\$25), UW La Crosse (\$25), and UW-Madison (\$70).

For the other UW universities, you may submit up to three applications for free to either the main campus or branch campus. After that, you will be charged \$25 per application. Note that UW-Stevens Point and UW-Whitewater allow you to apply to both their main campuses and branch campuses. Doing so will incur the same fee as applying to any single campus within that university.

The <u>UW Help Website</u> is your complete guide to the UW college process! Students can explore all 26 UW campuses, find their best-fit and learn strategies to pay for college. It includes information on the admission processes, preparing students for college, financial aid, majors at each campus, scholarships and more!

Seniors applying to a UW campus will also need to write an essay as part of the application (<u>UW essay</u> <u>prompts</u>). All UW's share the same essay prompt: This part is all about you. Tell us about something you've done — academically or personally — and what you've learned from it. Was it a success or a challenge? Did it represent a turning point in your life? How did this particular moment in your life influence you, and how will it continue to influence you as you pursue your college education?

UW-LaCrosse and UW-Madison have an additional essay question:

UW-La Crosse: Please respond to ONE of the following: (1) How will your life experiences or commitments enrich the UW-La Crosse campus community? OR (2) Tell us why you are interested in attending UW-La Crosse and what aspects of the campus are especially important to you.

UW-Madison: Tell us why you would like to attend the University of Wisconsin–Madison. In addition, please include why you are interested in studying the major(s) you have selected. If you selected undecided, please describe your areas of possible academic interest.

FINANCIAL AID

If you want help paying for school, it all starts with submitting your <u>Free Application For Federal Student Aid</u> (FAFSA). This year the <u>FAFSA</u> will become available in <u>December</u> for the 2024-2025 academic year. They are in the process of improving the application and we will make you aware when the updates are completed and open to applicants.

<u> PSAT - 2023 TEST DATE</u>

<u>ASVAB</u>

The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) will be offered at Wausau East to interested juniors and seniors on November 28, at 7:45 a.m. sharp. The ASVAB is a voluntary, free career aptitude test for students who plan to enter the military upon graduation or for students who want more career exploration. The ASVAB will match student's skills and interests to hundreds of occupations. The ASVAB is a three-hour assessment given during the school day followed by the interpretations of those results. Here are some tips for successful scholarship searching/ applying:

- Ask your teachers, mentors, etc. if they will write a letter of recommendation for you. Don't wait until right before it is due!
- Keep organized and track scholarships using a spreadsheet.
- Look for scholarships that are specific for your major, career field or interests.
- If you have a unique situation, look for scholarships that are open to students with your situation, i.e. overcame an obstacle or hardship.
- Be willing to put the time and effort in each day. Remember it is money you don't have to pay back.
- Ask for help and visit the Career Center often! In addition to the online scholarship page, the Career Center also posts scholarships on the scholarship board. Your school counselor, Career Center coordinator, teachers, etc. are all here to help.

<u> PSA - SELECTIVE SERVICE REGISTRATION</u>



Federal Law requires nearly all male US citizens and male immigrants, age 18 through 25, register with the <u>USA Selective Service</u> within 30 days of their 18th birthday. Students may register as early as three months after their 17th birthday. Failure to register will affect a student's ability to receive financial aid or job training. Academic and Career Planning (ACP) is a student-driven, adult-supported process in which students create and cultivate their own unique, information-based visions for post-secondary success, obtained through selfexploration, career exploration, and the development of career management and planning skills. Each grade level will practice goal setting and planning through assessments and written activities with the guidance of counselors, homeroom advisors, and parents. Student goals and plans are expected to change annually based on their own personal experiences. The components of the ACP will be saved in Xello, an online career platform.


