Crisis & Advocacy Services

24/7 Crisis Line - If a student needs crisis intervention or stabilization from a **Designated Crisis Responder (DCR),** call **1-888-910-0416**. The family will be assisted by Volunteers of America then forwarded to Kitsap Mental Health Services DCR. DCRs have the ability to detain people (ages 13+) against their will for imminent danger to self/others or grave disability due to a mental illness. DCRs cannot detain a person who is agreeable to voluntary treatment.

Youth Mobile Crisis Outreach Crisis Team(YMCOT) - If a student needs crisis interventions and connection to community resources; please call 1-888-910-0416 and request the YMCOT. Any student can use this service UNLESS they're already in WISe team. YMCOT offers home visits and provides crisis stabilization up to 14 days.

Crisis Line Services for School Professionals - 1-800-584-3578 Also managed by Volunteers of America and staffed with mental health professionals. Staff can call this number to consult, request a mobile outreach team to come to the school, request follow up for students, and explore inpatient bed availability. This is a great option if a student is dysregulated at school but is stable enough to create a safety plan instead of seeking immediate treatment. They are also available for consultation and resource referrals.

24/7 Crisis Lines - If a student needs crisis intervention or stabilization, or just would like someone to talk to, they can **call 988 or text "help" to 988** and they will be directed to the Suicide and Crisis Lifeline. There are options for LGBTQIA + (option 3 or respond with "Y" to text prompt) and Indigenous students (Native & Strong, Option 4).

Child Protective Services (CPS) - If you suspect child abuse or neglect please (a) call Child Protective Services at **1-888-713-6115** to report; and (b) complete an in-district CPS reporting form. Refer to school district policy for notification and documentation process.
