Students outlined classroom norms and expectations for the class structure. We got to know each other through the creation of a bulletin board "You are an important piece of the puzzle" as well as playing a get to know you bingo game. We have begun Unit I Argumentative writing and Non Fiction by creating short writings explaining our opinions on various topics guided by the RACER writing format. Each student has explored our library and has chosen an independent reading novel. Lastly, we celebrated Hispanic Heritage month by viewing various digital speakers and followed a graphic organizer to depict what more students learned in regards to Latinx globally.

All of the classes began the year with a review of New Jersey. We looked at its geography, its varied topography, its industries and population mix. We also reviewed the way immigration trends have affected our state from the 1800's to now. World History began with a look at the Age of Exploration and the role of natural resources. climate and the topography of Europe. US History I started with the impact of the Atlantic Slave trade and the impact it had on the native African tribes as well as the agricultural economy of the South. US History II studied the Industrial Revolution - its roots in Europe - and the effect it had on the new colonies of America. Major inventors were identified and we watched the urban areas grow based on the boost



The Work Readiness Academy serves students ages 18-21 with disabilities and provides a comprehensive employment training experience that incorporates both classroom-based instruction and community-based work-learning experiences. While in the training classroom, students work cooperatively with similar aged peers to learn critical skills related to employment and socialization. Students also work on career exploration and planning, including the development of a person-centered, postsecondary vision and plan with clear goals and action steps. Program staff remain on-site during the internships to provide and fade support and assistance as needed. Students also participate in field trips focused on career discovery, independent living skills, recreation and independent travel training.





Reopening of the 1571 Gymnasium!


When hurricane Ida hit NJ on September 1st 2021, no one knew the waters in the area would be able to do so much damage.



The 2023-2024 is off to a great start in the social work office. The students have all been placed with an Advocate – their first period teacher – who will reach home several times a month to communicate with parents regarding their academics, attendance and behavior in school. It takes

It's a new school year and the halls of Hillcrest Academy North are abuzz with science! All science classes began the year with a collaborative inquiry into the nature of science and the underlying principles that drive scientific discovery and thought. Biology students then launched into their studies of the characteristics of life and were able to successfully argue using evidence that viruses,



while seemingly so, are not, in fact, alive. Environmental Science students successfully wrapped their minds around the heady concept of The Big Bang and were able to apply the concepts of redshift and cosmic background radiation to their explanations of the origins of our universe. Through the use of multiple interactive scenarios, Forensic Science students learned that humans are horrible eyewitnesses and it takes a concerted effort from law enforcement to ensure impartiality and accuracy of testimony are maintained. Next month, Biology students will begin to understand the differences between cell types, Environmental Science students will discover Earth's place in our solar system, and Forensic Science students will begin to learn how to identify and collect physical evidence from crime scenes.
