

Ethnic Studies

In December, Ethnic Studies was approved thanks to several individuals who advocated for this curriculum at the Board Meetings, including SAB reps for the past three years. All of the district's high schools, Cordova High, Folsom High (Folsom Lake), Vista del Lago, Innovations Academy, Walnutwood High, and Kinney High will be putting forward a version of the course for the 2023-2024 school year, and this course will be a state graduation requirement for seniors starting in 2029.
